Reception- This week we have really enjoyed carrying on learning about the Easter story and making some Easter cards. All the children did an amazing job at singing in our Easter Service this week, the teachers are so proud of them! We have also enjoyed trying Easter foods, such as hot cross buns and doing fun Easter activities. The Easter Bunny hid Eggs around our classroom with tricky words on and we had to go and find them all. It was so much fun! We hope all the children enjoy their Easter break and we look forward to starting our new topic 'Adventures at Sea' after the half term.

Year 1- This week, we have had a great time learning about Easter. We learnt all about the Easter story and why we celebrate Easter. We made Easter cards and Easter nests to eat! In Maths we have been learning to count to 10 forwards and backwards. The children enjoyed writing the numbers outside on the playground and completing different challenges.

Year 2- This week, in English we have enjoyed writing our own nonsense poems. In R.E we have learnt about how Muslims celebrate new life and continued our Science work by thinking about what properties objects need to have and matching materials to them that could be used to make the objects perform their functions correctly.

Year 3 –We have been learning to recite a poem called The Dragon Who Ate Our School, videos of this can be seen on the website. They have also learnt about syllables and rhyming when writing their own poems. In Maths year 3 have finished off their perimeter work with an investigation into the biscuit with the longest perimeter, which was very hungry work. In Science they have been learning about how shadows are made and have investigated how to make bigger and smaller shadows.

Year 4- This week, we have been writing a guide with information about how to survive if we lived in the Amazon rainforest. In Maths, we have completed our end of term tests, which will identify which parts we need to recap next term. We have also enjoyed our virtual church service for Easter. In our RE lessons, we have been learning about what Sikhs believe in and what kind of a person Guru Nanak was.

Year 5- This week, we have continued to write the next part of our contemporary story based on the novel we are currently reading. We have recapped over fractions this week and the children have done amazing. All the staff in Year 5, are really impressed with how the children have returned to school and their attitude to learning. Have a fantastic holiday and we look forward to seeing the children refreshed and ready to learn.

Year 6- This week, we have enjoyed completing a 'see, think, wonder' activity – we looked at artwork depicting Christ's crucifixion and compared the images to the story in the bible. In English, we worked hard completing our non-chronological reports on natural disasters. In Geography, we enjoyed writing a persuasive leaflet to encourage tourists to Leeds.
