Dear Parents/carers,

Reminder:

Here are the rules regarding testing, if you have any questions please ask.

"Get tested for coronavirus (COVID-19)

There are different tests you can get to check if you have coronavirus (COVID-19). The test you need depends on why you're getting tested.

The 2 main tests are:

- PCR tests mainly for people with symptoms, they're sent to a lab to be checked
- rapid lateral flow tests only for people who do not have symptoms, they give a result in 30 minutes Both tests are free.

If you have symptoms of COVID-19 - you must have a PCR test

If you have any of these symptoms:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

You and anyone you live with should stay at home until you get your test result. Only leave your home to have a test. Anyone in your childcare or support bubble should also stay at home if you have been in close contact with them since your symptoms started or during the 48 hours before they started."

IMPORTANT - Over this weekend if your child has a positive COVID test please contact school either using the COVID email: **covidtesting@stbartsleeds.org.uk** or by calling Mrs Wainwright on **07926128159**. This is essential in order for us to take quick action and inform any parents that their children need to isolate. The current guidance is that we continue to close a bubble if a child or teacher in that class has a positive result.

Punctuality in Nursery

Children in nursery must be on time. The session in the afternoon starts at 12.30pm and their doors close at 12.35pm. After that, you must report to the office. This will mean you waiting there with your child until someone is available to take them to Nursery. This is inconvenient for you and the school but more importantly means your child missing the start of the session and sometimes causing them to become upset having to go with unfamiliar staff through the school building.

Hot Weather - Drinks in school

We know that children need to drink during the day and especially in hot weather. A number of parents have asked if children can bring their own drink/water to school. This is not possible as we have over 600 children and managing this would be impossible. The only drink allowed during the school day is water and we provide this for all children. Every child has a school bottle and this is refilled as needed with fresh drinking water. Children can only bring their own drink if agreed with school for medical reasons, please see Mrs Wainwright if you want to discuss this.
