Welcome back to everyone, it has been fantastic to have all the children back in school. The children have settled well into the routines and especially to learning. ## **Reminders:**

- Children must be here and collected at the end of the day on time. This is to prevent children from different bubbles waiting at the office and having to be taken through school.

If your child or anyone in your house has symptoms, you must book a test for that person and you must all isolate. If the test result comes back negative you can all finish isolating and if well enough return to school. If positive, you will need to continue isolating for 10 days.

If your child needs to isolate due to COVID we will provide work, if you need support with computers during this time we can help. Just ask.

#### **Weekly Round-Up**

**Nursery**- Oh, it is wonderful to have all the children back in Nursery. At the moment our topics are Dinosaurs and Pirates. We are reading fiction and non-fiction books about dinosaurs and pirates and finding out about how they lived, where they lived and the adventures they might have had. The children are loving looking at all the non-fiction dinosaur books and recognising and naming all the different ones. We have discovered that some dinosaurs only eat meat whilst others only eat plants. The T-Rex is a favourite dinosaur, with all children recognising him and roaring just like he would have done. Next week we are on the high seas, looking for treasure using some pirate treasure maps.

**Reception**-This week very pleased to welcome back all our children. Our new topic is in the garden. We have gad lots of fun this week learning about caterpillars, butterflies and reading stories about mini beasts. We have also been learning number bonds to 10 in Maths.

**Year 1**-The teachers are very proud of all the children in year 1 for how well they have settled back in to school. We have enjoyed learning about traditional tales. We have also enjoyed taking part in Science Week and learning about plants. The children planted their own beans like Jack and the Beanstalk. We look forward to looking after them and watching them grow.

**Year 2**-This week we have enjoyed carrying out several experiments with eggs as part of Science Week, including trying to make a bouncy egg! We have begun to look at maps in Geography and learnt about compass points this week. In Mathematics we are continuing our work on multiplication and division. Please help us practise counting in twos and fives from zero to one hundred at home.

Year 3 -This week, Year 3 have been recapping some work on time that we did at home. We are covering all of the areas we found tricky when not in school. We have been reading a book called 'The Tunnel' and have been writing diaries in role as one of the characters. In PSHE, we have been looking at cooperation and working in teams - this helped us when we worked in small groups to create a tower made out of spaghetti and marshmallows for our Science Week enrichment.

**Year 4**-This week, Year 4 have been reading a book called 'The Great Kapok Tree'. We have then started writing a leaflet about deforestation in rainforests. In Maths, we have been building upon the great work we did at home on fractions and applying it to some new work on decimals. After months of not being able to play out as much, we have had great fun running around learning some new netball skills in PE. We have also loved some of the Science Week activities we have completed, especially creating a volcano!

**Year 5**- Have settled back into school life really well this week; we are very happy to see them back in school! This week, we have started to learn about balanced arguments and their key features. We have enjoyed taking part in Science Week where we have built a replica of the Eiffel Tower using marshmallows and spaghetti, which was lots of fun and very sticky. We have also taken part in lots of other activities.

Year 6-It has been lovely to see all Year 6 children return to school with smiling faces! In RE, children have enjoyed learning about the story of Jesus's death and resurrection. In Maths, children have recapped over addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of fractions. In English, children completed work on semi-colons and enjoyed investigating words in context. For Science Week, children enjoyed completing fun investigations and taking part in a virtual falcon workshop.
