The squirrels got to the conkers before me at the weekend so I am off looking for some more this weekend. Thank you to Oliver for bringing in what he found at the weekend. Please if you are out and about could you collect conkers, acorns and beautifully coloured leaves.

Meanwood Urban Farm has been receiving some great reviews, so it might be a place to visit. Admission fees are £2.50 for adults and 50p for children, under 2 years old free.

Reception - This week in Reception we have enjoyed performing the story Goldilocks using a story map and actions. Next week we will be trying porridge with lots of different toppings! There has been lots of interest in emergency vehicles in Reception and we have worked hard to create our own vehicles in the box modelling area. There has been lots of singing in Reception and we are working hard to learn our harvest songs. Look out for our goldilocks videos on the website next week.

Year 1 – We have enjoyed a local walk around Armley this week as part of their Geography topic. They spotted local places and then wrote a list about them in English. Next week the children will be making their own maps. In Maths, the children have been ordering numbers and looking at missing numbers. In Reading, the children have been enjoying reading the story, Funny Bones.

Year 2 – We will be continuing to write about castles in literacy, using adjectives and nouns to describe them. Ask them to show you the actions we have created. In Maths we will be finishing off our place value work by counting in 2's, 5's and 10's to get us ready for learning our times tables. In computing we have learnt to log on using our own user name and password and are learning about the basics of programming through a programme called Scratch.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have been reading biographies and have been building up to writing one about Charles Dickins, the author of 'Oliver Twist'. In Science, we have been on a sound hunt around school to identify quiet and loud places. We have measured this using a decibel meter which measures sounds. In our Victorian topic, we have been looking at inventions and placing them on a timeline. During French lessons, Year 3 have been looking at ways to greet people and Year 4 have been naming body parts. You will have now received a letter about our upcoming trip to Armley Mills. Please ensure this letter and the £2 contribution are sent to school as soon as possible.

Year 5 - This week in Year 5, we have been looking at how flashbacks can make a story even more interesting. We have looked at the key features of flashbacks and used the story of 'I Survived the Sinking of the Titanic' to create our own flashbacks, whilst in character. In Maths this week, we moved onto adding and subtracting, whilst solving problems. In Art this week, we have continued to learn new skills such as hatching and cross hatching and next week we will create our own masterpieces using all the skills we have acquired over the last four weeks.

Year 6 – In English, we have enjoyed looking at the career of Tom Palmer and reading some of his books. We also enjoyed listening to Tom talk about his career and his passion for writing. In Maths, we have looked at multiplying numbers and completing work on negative numbers. In Science, we completed our 'heart' models explaining how the heart works.
