COVID Update

This term has been a difficult one as cases of COVID continue throughout school. This week we have had two new confirmed cases. We are continuing with our cleaning regimes and other protective measures, we have not yet started mixing year groups for any larger scale activities and Worship and assemblies are still virtual. This will not change over the next term as the situation nationally worsens and case numbers grow. In the run-up to Christmas, we would usually have been planning Christmas events (Fayre, concerts and disco). This year will unfortunately be different again. We will not be holding any large-scale events although we are planning to have a celebration week at the end of term where all children will be involved in different activities (Parties, pantomime and we have some special visitors coming for a day). More information will follow. Please do not send your child to school if they have symptoms and if you need advice call 111 or 119. Please keep us informed and be aware we will call you if we are concerned about your child in school.

Please be considerate of the people who live around school, **you must not block their driveways**. We have had local residents who have not been able to get out of their driveways and have been late for very important appointments or for collecting their own children. There has also been an increase in incidents outside the main gate where parents are parking on the curb and yellow lines, putting our children and families who walk to school in danger. The police have been informed about this problem and we expect an increased presence and potential fining for illegal parking. This has happened to parents before. I know there is a lack of parking around school but we have to do our best to keep everyone safe.

Weekly Round Up

Year 2 - Year 2 have been comparing Rapunzel and The Paper Bag Princess in their English lessons, using conjunctions to extend sentences. In Maths, Year 2 have been learning how to add 2 digit numbers using column addition and apply this to problems. We have been learning about Black History in theme, thinking what makes us all unique, comparing Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale and how they were remembered.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have enjoyed studying the lives of black people throughout history. Year 3 have been learning about the Windrush generation and plotting the route they took to get here from the Caribbean countries. Year 4 have looked at important people throughout history, such as Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King. We enjoyed linking our English work on biographies into this week. Across the week, children also took part in a variety of workshops, including African dance, African drumming and playing steel pans.

Year 5 - This week, in Year 5 the children have been celebrating Black History Month. The children have all taken part in workshops to celebrate Black History and you can see the pictures and videos on the website. The children have found it interesting to learn about the Atlantic Slave Trade and how it was eventually abolished. The children have written some fantastic newspaper reports of the Atlantic Slave Trade, which you will also be able to see on the website. A big well done to the three children who have been asked to take part in a swimming trial for Leeds.

Year 6 -Class 18 will be the first Year 6 class to take part in Bikeability (week beginning 1st November). Children in Class 18 will have received a letter detailing when in the week they will be taking part in Bikeability. Class 17 will have Bikeability in the week beginning 8th November and Class 19 will have Bikeability in the week beginning 15th November. Letters on when children will be taking part will be issued the week before. Class 17 will continue to attend swimming lessons after the half term break.
