

#### **Weekly Round Up**

Nursery- This half term seems to be flying by. The children have all loved the story Owl Babies and some have even used a story map to retell the story to others. Our book area is looking lovely with the work the children have done about owls and other nocturnal animals. We have planted bulbs that will hopefully flower next term, we researched which way to put the bulbs into the compost and we are going to water them daily- unless rain beats us to it! We are going to read books about hedgehogs next week- The Very Helpful Hedgehog and It was a Cold Dark Night. **Reception** – This week we have enjoyed listening to the story 'The princess and the wizard' by one of our favourite authors, Julia Donaldson. We have enjoyed lots of magical activities including wand making, mark making in glitter and creating potions. In Maths we have been looking at the numbers 4 and 5, one more and one less and looking at all the different ways we can make the amounts. We have enjoyed watching number blocks videos and listening to Maths stories such as Pete's 4 Groovy Buttons and Kipper's Birthday. Following on from our learning about how births are celebrated, this week we have talked a lot about how our Birthdays are celebrated each year. Please upload any birthday photos onto Learning Journals for us to share.

**Year 1-** Year 1 have enjoyed learning all about the story of Stickman this week. They enjoyed going on a noun walk around the school grounds and also learnt about proper nouns. In Maths, we have had a fun week learning about shapes. The children have been looking at and describing 2D and 3D shapes. They have enjoyed making shape pictures. **Reminder:** Please ensure your child comes to school dressed appropriately on PE days. They can wear leggings, jogging bottoms, a red or white t-shirt and trainers. Please see the allocated PE days on the school website.

**Year 2** – Year 2 have started reading Voices In The Park by Anthony Browne in literacy, the children have enjoyed relating to the characters and comparing them using and, but and because. In Maths we have started a unit on money, we have learnt to recognise coins and notes, and have started to make amounts. In Design Technology we have been learning about stable structures and have tested and designed a stable structure based on a castle.

**Year 3 & 4** –This week, Year 4 have been starting to look at diaries in our English lessons. We have looked at the features to help us write our own Victorian diaries in the coming weeks. In Maths, we have continued to look at multiplication and division, and have had a big focus on our times tables. By the end of Year 4, we have to know all of our tables up to 12 x 12. In Science, we have started looking at states of matter and developing our understanding of solids, liquids and gases. We enjoyed looking at and creating our own class census in Geography and enjoyed writing sentences about our classrooms (Year 3) and a zoo (Year 4) in French.

**Year 5 -** In English, children have continued reading scary stories and enjoyed writing and editing their own scary stories. Amazing stories have been written by Year 5 - well done! In Geography, children have investigated icebergs and their structures. Next week, each class will have a HMP not for me day at school. Each class will have a day: Class 16 on Tuesday 30th November

**Year 6** – In English, we have continued to look at poetry and investigating author's choice. In Maths, children have enjoyed working on fractions. In PE, Children have thoroughly enjoyed working on dance routines and developing their rugby skills.
