Weekly Round Up

Reception- We have had a very exciting week in Reception this week! Our eggs arrived and have hatched! The children have spent lots of time watching the incubator and looking closely for cracks. Some of the children even chose to read a book to them to encourage the chick's to enter the world. Next week we will be making bird feeder and bird houses to put in our outdoor area for the local birds. On Wednesday we had a visit from the Nursery ducklings. They were very friendly and the children were really gentle when stroking them. Look out for photos on Learning journals and the website.

Year 1- Children have really enjoyed their visit to the farm this week. They had a great time looking at the different animals and learning about how the farm cares for them. Children also participated in a composting workshop and a minibeast trail. It has been fantastic to see children experiencing such hands on learning which will be extremely useful for their understanding of this half term's topic of Roots, Shoots and Muddy Boot!

Year 2- Year 2 have been reading the book A Walk in London in English, they have learnt about London landmarks and what it is like to be in London. In Maths they have named and labelled 3D shapes as well as sorting them and using them to create patterns. For Science week we have planted beans and have been completing plant diaries, we have been conducting experiments to find out what plants need to survive and looking at the life cycle of plants.

Year 3 & 4 –This week, Year 4 have enjoyed writing an explanation text about jaguars in our English lessons. In Maths, we have continued to calculate using fractions. This week has also been Science week. Our topic this year is 'Growth' and we have taken part in a range of experiments and watched a series of live assemblies online. We also enjoyed entering the British Science Week poster competition. See the website for more pictures about our exciting week.

Year 5 & 6 – Year 5 Bikeability- Class 15 have thoroughly enjoyed taking part in Bikeability. Class 16 will take part next week. In English, children have enjoyed writing their own sales pitch using persuasive language. In Design and Technology, children have worked on learning about the structures that make up bridges.

Year 6 - Well done to everyone in Year 6 for the effort and hard work whilst testing this week. All the staff are very proud of the children. In Geography, children have enjoyed researching different tourist attractions in Leeds and will be looking at creating their own brochure, advertising the wonderful sights of Leeds.
