Weekly Round Up

Reception- This week we were shocked to see how much the chicks have grown! They have even started growing feathers on their wings and they made us jump when they started running across the carpet flapping their wings! We have been reading the story Chicken Licken and have enjoyed making bird feeders to hang on our tree. We used lots of natural materials to make houses for our little chicks such as pebbles, sticks, leaves and logs. Next week we are going to be reading the story 'The Very Greedy Bee '. Can you find out any bee facts over the weekend?

Year 1- In English this week children have loved reading the story of Farmer Duck. They have studied and compared the different characters in the story. In Geography children have used their knowledge from their visit to the farm to look at how the different seasons effect life on the farm. Please see the school website for pictures of the children enjoying their visit to Meanwood Valley Urban Farm. In Science children are learning about different wild and garden plants. They have been encouraged to spot these at home or in their local area if possible.

Year 2-Year 2 went on a little blue bus tour of Leeds this week, just like London tourists go on a Big Red Bus tour of London. We saw, photographed and learnt about Leeds Town Hall, Leeds Arena, Leeds Kirkgate Market, the Recycling Centre and Elland Road. The children loved the trip and got to experience what it was like to be a tourist. Ask them about the landmarks of Leeds or London and see what they can tell you.

Year 3 & 4 –This week, we have been amazed to learn about a lady called Julian Koepcke, who survived a plane crash that landed in the Amazon rainforest. We investigated her amazing story, which helped us in turn to write our own survival guide. In Maths, we have been checking on our learning over the term by doing some tests, which will tell our teachers what things we need to focus on for the rest of this year. In our French lessons, we have been learning a bit more about French culture and have been looking at how Easter is celebrated there. In Science we explored food chains and in our design technology lessons, we have been looking at the ingredients in a Brazilian dish.

Year 5 & 6 – Bikeability - Class 16 have thoroughly enjoyed taking part in Bikeability. Well done all Year 5 children who have taken part in Bikeability over the past three weeks.

Swimming - Well done to all children who have taken part in swimming this term. There will be no swimming next week. Swimming will start again the week beginning 25th April.
