<u>Playground Equipment</u> - Please do not let your children play on the playground equipment before or after school when they are with you. We cannot supervise this and do not want any accidents. <u>Attendance</u> - We are aiming to be above the minimum national target for children this term. This is above 96% attendance. Last week was 94.8%. This is a way off the target but with a big effort from everyone, Nursery to Year 6 we can do it.

Please bring your children every day and on time unless they are too unwell to attend.

You must let school know if you have not already if your child will be off on Tuesday due to Eid. Remember Monday is a Bank Holiday so you do not need to book this off, if this is the day you will be observing this special day.

Parking - Please make sure that you do not park on the yellow lines outside the main gate or on the curb. If you park at the other side on the street please make sure you do not block a residents drive or park on the curb. For children's safety if you park on the opposite side of the road from school please make sure you cross your children over the road.

Vaccinations information - Children aged 5 to 11 are now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. Parents and guardians can now book appointments for 5 to 11 year olds. You can call the National Booking Service on 119 to make an appointment. You will need to take your child to a local pharmacy or vaccination centre. Many thanks for your support with this.

<u>Uniform</u> - Thank you to everyone who has donated used uniform to school. We have helped several families and will continue with a regular uniform bank the second Thursday of every half term. If you need any support with this at any other time, just ask. Please bring any donations to the office.

Nursery - We are continuing to enjoy listening to and acting out different traditional tales. Reception - Last week we enjoyed learning about ladybirds so much that we decided to continue it into this week. We enjoyed listening to the story 'The Bad Tempered Ladybird' and had lots of fun making ladybird biscuits. We used our phonic knowledge to write instructions of how to make them at home. Next week we are looking forward to learning all about worms and reading one of our favourite stories Superworm.

Year 2 – Year 2 have been working hard on their reasoning and problem solving in Maths applying basic functions. In Literacy they have written a letter pretending to be one of the Pirates Next Door's neighbours. They wrote a letter of complaint, including all the reasons they want the pirates gone. In Computing they are using stop animation to create a pirate theme story using a lego man and homemade backgrounds and props. Keep an eye out for them on the website when they are finished.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have been looking at persuasive writing in our English lessons. We have been reading and learning more information about Ancient Egyptians and have been learning what a pharaoh is, and which one was the greatest! In Art, we have been looking at collages and have been learning skills to make our Egyptian collages more effective. In Maths, we have been looking at fractions and decimals. Year 4 have also started some rugby workshops with a PE coach.
