Weekly Round Up

Nursery - I hope that everyone who celebrated Eid had a wonderful time. Nursery have been enjoying the activities that relate to The Billy Goats Gruff and the retelling of the story has been amazing. The repeated phase "Who's that trip trapping over my bridge" has been constantly heard both inside and outside Nursery, with the responses "it's me, the small/middle sized/large Billy Goat Gruff". We have been using lots of positional language- under, over, beside, next to, behind, in front when describing where the goats and troll are when we are placing them in tuff trays, paper and when acting the story out. Next week we are reading about the Gingerbread Man who says "run, run, as fast as you can you can't catch me I'm the Gingerbread Man!" We will be testing our memory skills by trying to remember the order of people that chase after the cheeky Gingerbread Man. We will adding buttons to our own Gingerbread Men with paint, collage materials and actual buttons. We will be practicing our mark making skills and exercising our fingers to help us with our pencil grip and control. I am including a link to Leeds Urban Bike Park which sounds fun for all the family- bike hire available. Leeds Urban Bike Park, Ring Road, Beeston Park, Middleton, Leeds.

Reception - In Reception this week we have really enjoyed learning about worms and we're shocked to find out that they don't have any eyes but see using vibrations! We have listened carefully to the story 'Superworm' and have made our own sock worms and worms of different lengths using pasta. We have worked hard to measure our worms using cubes and have done some fantastic writing about the story.

Year 1 – This week children have been reading the book 'The Ugly S' by Julia Donaldson. They have been writing some impressive descriptions of the different animals from the book. In Geography children have continued learning about Africa and have compared the climate in Kenya to that in the UK. All children in Year 1 have been working with music specialist to learn about African music. They have loved learning about beats and exploring movements of different animals from Africa. Children will be working with the music specialist for the rest of the term and will be introduced to a range of African instruments. Please can all jumpers be labelled with children's names as many are getting misplaced due to children taking them off because of the warmer weather, thank you for your help with this.

Year 2 – Year 2 have started reading a non-fiction text all about pirates, they have gathered information, written coordinating and sub-ordinating sentences, as well as expanded noun phrases to describe a pirate. In Maths we have focused on reasoning and problem solving. In Science we have been learning whether an animal is a carnivore, omnivore or herbivore, ask your child if they can tell you who eats what. In PE we have been striking and fielding, learning about target games and working hard on our throwing and catching.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have enjoyed writing a piece of persuasive writing, trying to get people to visit Egypt. We also learned about food chains in Science and drew examples of our own. In PSHE, we have continued to learn the important skill of first aid and how to cope with emergency situations. Year 4 also enjoyed our rugby workshops with Leeds Rhinos. Last week, Class 11 received some postcards from pen pals in France. This week, we have created our own to send back to them!

Year 5 & 6 - Year 6 - SATs week is next week and it is so important that all Year 6 children attend every day and arrive at school on time. Children have been working very hard in preparation for next week - they should be very proud of themselves. A SAT's quick guide is on the school website in Parents section, KS2 Assessments. In PE, Year 6 have enjoyed developing their skills in volleyball and athletics.

Year 5- In Design and Technology, children have enjoyed continuing looking at bridges and also designing and making their own model bridges. In English, children have begun writing their own Ancient Greek myths.
