We will not authorise any absence unless it is exceptional circumstances and these must be discussed and agreed before you plan to travel.

From September we will be considering fining from 5 days, please bear this in mind before you book.

<u>Hepatitis</u> - There is an increase in the number of cases of Hepatitis across the country. Although this affects a very small number of children it can be extremely dangerous. We have been asked to share with you this information so you can be vigilant. The potential signs and symptoms are:

- > abdominal pain
- loss of appetite
- nausea
- fever and fatigue
- Followed by jaundice (yellowing of the skin and eyes), dark urine and pale faeces.

Most of these symptoms are also signs of many common illnesses, if you are at all concerned please seek medical advice.

<u>PE</u> – Reminder please send your child to school on their PE days in their PE kit which should be grey or black tracksuit bottoms, shorts or leggings and a red or white plain t- shirt and suitable footwear.

<u>Reports</u> - You will receive your child's end of year report on Friday 8th July and there will be an opportunity the following week to discuss these with their teacher if you wish to.

<u>Footballs</u> – If children bring their own footballs to school they need to have their name and class on them. School is unable to accept responsibility if they get lost or go over the fence.

Weekly Round Up

Nursery –'Run, run, as fast as you can, you can't catch me I'm the Gingerbread Man!' This has been a very popular book, with the children retelling the story and acting it out in the playground. We have been ordering the people and animals who chased after the cheeky chap, made bridges that could have saved the Gingerbread Man from his fate and painted some wonderful Gingerbread Men. Next week we are using the book Little Red Riding Hood as our teaching prompt, again it allows for plenty of role play and cooperative play.

Reception - After learning all about worms and ladybirds lots of children in Reception were keen to learn about butterflies. We listened to one of our favourite stories 'The very hungry caterpillar'. We looked at the life cycle of a butterfly and used pasta bows, shells and twists to show the different stages of the life cycle. We have also enjoyed creating hand print caterpillars. In maths we have been solving addition problems using first, then and now. Next week we will be planting seeds and talking about what plants need to grow.

Year 1 – Children have really enjoyed tasting a variety of different fruit, some that have come all the way from Africa! Children have then designed their own fruit smoothie. We also had a visit from Mrs Field's tortoise, to help the children understand different types of animals such as reptiles.

Year 2 –Year 2 have been learning about Blackbeard the Pirate in English and have written a wanted poster. In Maths they have been applying their place value knowledge to support their reasoning and problem solving. In R.E they have been learning about different types of praying and writing their own prayer. Year 2 have also been working very hard completing their Maths SAT's and we are very proud of all the effort they have put in.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, we have started to look at explanation texts. We have been reading a text called 'How I Met Dudley' and looking at the features. In History, we have been looking at pyramids and what their purpose was. We have also been trying to read hieroglyphs, which is an ancient alphabet that the Egyptians used to use. In Maths, we have been using money to work out problems and in French, we have been in role as somebody in a French shop.

Year 5 - In English, children have continued writing their own Ancient Greek Myth. In Maths, children have begun looking at different types of angles. In Art, children have started looking at printing and have enjoyed researching famous artists.
