Headlice - Head Lice are a common problem in school aged children. They cannot be prevented, but regular checking ensures early detection and treatment if necessary. Parents and carers should check their children's head once a week during hair washing. You need your usual shampoo, conditioner, and a detection comb – ask your local pharmacist to recommend a suitable one. Remember that you are looking for living moving lice, which is the only evidence that your child is infected. If you find a living louse, sellotape it to a piece of light coloured paper and take it to your local pharmacy (Leeds only) who will advise you and can provide free Hedrin lotion under the Pharmacy First Minor Ailments Scheme. Combs are available from the office.

Weekly Round Up

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been using mathematical language such as long, tall, short, big and small when comparing and measuring different objects. We have used cubes to measure and explain how we know which object is the tallest. We enjoyed drawing round our feet and measuring them although it tickled a bit! We have spent lots of time this week talking about how to be a good friend. We enjoyed listening to the story Rainbow Fish and have added some shiny glittery scales to our playdough.

Year 1 & 2 – We would like to politely remind parents/carers about the importance of making sure children come to school prepared for the day. Each morning children need to bring their reading book, yellow record, pink spelling book and any homework they need to hand in. children receive Maths homework every Monday that is due in by Friday or earlier if completed. Please only complete 1 page each week. We have had a very busy week in school. Classes 3, 4 and 5 really enjoyed their visit from a Polar Explorer! They asked many interesting questions and will be using what they have learnt to do in some fantastic writing in English. Children in classes 6 and 7 have looked at how Muslim families welcome new babies in RE and have shown different customs on a poster. Next week classes 6 and 7 will be enjoying their Great fire of London Day on Monday. The children are excited.

Year 3 & 4—This week, we have enjoyed reading the poem 'The coming of the Iron Man' by Brenda Williams. It is a poetry version of the first chapter of the Iron Man, which we have really enjoyed reading over this half term. In history, we have been looking at Roman towns. We have been using sources of evidence and artefacts to help us learn more about them. In PE, we have been putting together our gymnastics routines. We also had a fun day for number day. Well done to all of the children who dressed up and for helping us raise money for the NSPCC. We took part in lots of fun number based activities over the day.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In English, children have been writing 'internal monologues' as a character based on the book they are reading, Skellig. Class 15 asked Mr Needham to listen to some of them – he was very impressed with their writing and with the performances of the monologues. In Math's, children have been dividing numbers and working on fractions. In Science, children have enjoyed learning about renewable energy.
