Reception - In Reception this week there has been lots of discussion about the changing seasons. We have used all the wonderful Autumn items collected from our home challenge to create repeated patterns, Autumn wreaths and spiky leaf hedgehogs! We have really enjoyed looking at all the lovely baby photos that have been sent in so far and have been talking about how we have changed since babies. We have had lots of fun washing the dolls in the water tray and talking about how to care for babies.

Year 1 & 2 – In Year 1 this week children have been collecting Autumn objects to use in their learning. They have really enjoyed sketching Autumn leaves and using conkers to help them with adding numbers. In English children have been writing sentences using 'and' to describe what the characters in funny bones saw. In Year 2 children have continued learning about materials in Science. They have looked at different objects, explored the properties of materials they are made from. In Art the children have continued with their Art work in the style of Leonid Afremov. This week they completed a tutorial to draw a castle. Children in classes 6 and 7 really enjoyed their kitchen in the classroom workshops, where they learnt about food hygiene and made some delicious treats. See the website for pictures.

Please can we remind all parents/carers to check their child's book bag for important letters. Many letters for parents evening have been found still in book bags and we wouldn't want you to miss important information.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have started reading a non-fiction text about the Anglo-Saxons. We have been looking at the features of information texts and have been learning some new vocabulary. In science, we have continued to observe our plants, checking how they grow in different environments (e.g. light and dark). In RE, we learned about Passover and how Jews celebrate this event. In Maths, we have enjoyed adding and subtracting numbers, building upon our place value knowledge from earlier in this half term. In PE, we have continued to practise our dodgeball and football skills and have started to play longer games.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons: In English, children are working on writing a narrative as an evacuee. In Maths, children have worked on multiplying numbers by two-digit numbers. In History, children have used clues from different texts and images to help them understand reasons why Britain won the Battle of Britain and defeated the German Luftwaffe.

Eden Camp - Classes 14 and 17 have thoroughly enjoyed their trips to Eden Camp this week. A big thank-you to all the children for demonstrating excellent behaviour.
