Reception - This week in Reception we have been learning all about Diwali and how it is celebrated. We have had lots of fun creating rangoli patterns and diwa lamps. Year 1 & 2 — It has been fantastic to see or speak to so many parents and carers this week during our parent's consultation. Thank you all for attending! This week in Year 1, the children have been designing their own carnival masks as part of celebrating Black History Month. The children have described their Maths and English using a range of adjectives. In Year 2 this week children have created their own leaflet about castles using all the knowledge they have learnt so far. In English children have enjoyed writing a recount about their 'kitchen in the classroom' experience last week, hopefully you all saw the photos on the website and our school Facebook page.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have continued to read a non-fiction text about the Anglo-Saxons. We have also started to write our own extract in this same formal style. In Maths, we have been learning to add and subtract numbers using our knowledge of place value to support us. To commemorate Black History Month, we have been looking at significant time periods. Year 3 have been looking at the Windrush generation and have been making a carnival mask, whilst Year 4 have been looking at the theme of segregation, and have been learning about Rosa Parks. Year 4 then created a protest scene in the style of Van Gogh, who we have been learning about in our art lessons.

Year 5 & 6 – A big thank-you to all the children for a very successful half term. The children have all applied themselves extremely well and they should be very proud of themselves. **Lessons:** Children have all tried very hard with the tests they have taken this week. All the teachers have been very impressed with their attitude and effort. In Art, children have completed their charcoal poppy scenes – work has been of a very high standard. In Science, children have completed their pulse rate investigations.
