Weekly Round Up

Nursery – Another great week in Nursery, we have done lots of sorting, counting and introduced repeating patterns. We are getting to grips with simple patterns using colours, shapes, people and body percussion- clap, stamp, clap, stamp. We have been learning about animals that hibernate for the winter and followed the adventures of Ned the Hedgehog as he found a safe, warm place to hibernate for the winter. Next week we are reading the book Owl Babies and will be learning many owl facts. Reception –In Reception this week, we have been listening to the story Jack and the beanstalk. In drawing club, we have worked hard to draw the giant and his castle and come up with a plan to catch Jack. We have enjoyed building castles using Lego and printing castles with wooden bricks. In Maths, we have been looking at numbers 4 and 5. We have made number posters in small groups. We are working hard to learn the songs for our Christmas concert and cannot wait to perform for everyone.

Years 1 & 2 – This week children in Year 1 have welcomed the character of stickman into their classroom. They have loved reading the story and looking at different ways stickman was used. The children have learnt about different nouns in English and have then looked at what a proper noun is. They worked together to identify proper nouns from the story of stickman, remembering they begin with capital letters. In Year 2, children have begun their author study of Anthony Browne and read Voices in the Park. The children have been using adjective phrases to describe the different characters that will then lead on to them creating a character profile and character comparison.

Years 3 & 4 – This week, Year 3 have been reading a non-fiction book about great women who did spectacular things that changed the world. Year 4, have continued writing their fairy-tale stories and will be publishing them this week during their computing lesson. In Geography this term, we are learning about megacities. In this week's lesson, we have been looking at why Brasilia is the fastest growing city in Brazil. In DT this term, we are making photo frames. This week, we are looking at making stable structures and how we can strengthen our designs further. In French, we have been learning the names of different classroom objects.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In Geography, children have enjoyed learning about the mountains in the UK and why they are smaller than other mountains around the world. Swimming lessons are continuing to go well and all children are making good progress.

Trips - Classes 15, 16 & 17 have all visited the Veolia Leeds Recycling and Energy Recovery Centre. Children spent time asking questions about the facility, completing sorting activities and visiting the control room. The children should be very proud of themselves for the exemplary behaviour displayed whilst on the visit. Class 14 will visit the Centre on Friday 2nd December and Class 13 will visit on Wednesday 7th December.

High School Applications

Applications for secondary school places in September 2023 can still be made, so it is extremely important you do this if you have not already. An update from Leeds.Gov.UK states the following: If you submit your application after the deadline it could be treated with a lower priority than applications submitted on time.

If you submit your application:

- by 28 November 2022, most Leeds schools will treat the application as on time (check if this date applies on each school's admissions policy)
- by 31 December 2022, your application will receive a lower priority than those submitted on time (unless we agree you had exceptional reasons for missing this date)
- on or after 1 January 2023, you will not receive a school offer until April, after all other school places have been given out.
