- I have had a few incidents reported to me about inappropriate language being used by parents. This is not acceptable around our children and will not be tolerated. This includes when you are speaking to the staff. Continued use of bad language may result in you being asked not to come on the school site.

**Reception** – This week in Reception we have been reading the Jolly Christmas postman we have enjoyed reading the letters in the story from lots of different story characters. We have been creating post offices in our classroom and have worked hard to write lists of the things we will need. We are looking forward to completing lots of Christmas activities over the next 2 weeks and are very excited to be performing our concert on Friday 9th December.

Years 1 & 2 – This week in Year 1, children have been exploring numbers to 20 looking at different representing and understanding tens and ones. In RE children have enjoyed learning about the celebrations of EID and how it is important to Muslims. They got very busy making their own moon and star to celebrate this Islamic festival. In Year 2, children have worked hard writing their own character descriptions and comparing different characters. In Geography, children have investigated the different countries around the world and their climate. They have found the equator and understand where hot and cold countries are found.

Years 3 & 4 – This week in English, Year 3 have been performing some multi-cultural poems, whilst Year 4 have been looking at non-fiction texts about great women who changed the world. We have started to create our own fact files. In French, we have been writing about classroom objects and trying to put our ideas into full sentences. In geography, we have continued to learn about megacities. Last week, we looked at how Brasilia (the capital of Brazil) was formed and looked at overpopulated areas. This week, we are looking at the positives and negatives of living in a megacity and thinking about our own experience of living in Leeds. In DT, we have designed our photo frames, ready to start building them before the end of term. In PSHE, we have been looking at what bullying is and how it can be stopped if it ever happens to us. Trip letters have gone out now - please return these to your child's class teacher as soon as possible. Mr Waters has also had to speak to a few children about their PE kits over the past few weeks. Please remember that children are to wear their red t-shirt that was given out, and should not be wearing any branded tops.

**Year 5 & 6 – Lessons** - In English, children have enjoyed their first week of poetry where they have read 'The Pobble who has no toes' and answered different questions about the poem. In Math's, children have worked extremely hard on fractions.

**Trips** - Classes 14, 15, 16 & 17 have now all visited the Veolia Leeds Recycling and Energy Recovery Centre. Children spent time asking questions about the facility, completing sorting activities and visiting the control room. The children should be very proud of themselves for the exemplary behaviour displayed whilst on the visit. Class 13 will visit on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> December.

**Swimming** - The last swimming lesson for each class will be next week. There will be no swimming in the last week of term - week beginning 12<sup>th</sup> December. Swimming will start again in the second week of Spring term – week beginning 9<sup>th</sup> January.

#### **High School Applications**

Applications for secondary school places in September 2023 can still be made, so it is extremely important you do this if you have not already. An update from Leeds.Gov.UK states the following: If you submit your application after the deadline, it could be treated with a lower priority than applications submitted on time.

If you submit your application:

- by 28 November 2022, most Leeds schools will treat the application as on time (check if this date applies on each school's admissions policy)
- by 31 December 2022, your application will receive a lower priority than those submitted on time (unless we agree you had exceptional reasons for missing this date)
- On or after 1 January 2023, you will not receive a school offer until April; after all other school places have been given out.
