Something Mrs Wainwright has enjoyed this week was seeing the children riding their bikes in the playground. They were so excited and it is a fantastic skill to learn.

Worship – Our current theme is <u>Generosity</u> and this week we have been looking at courageous people including those from our bible story, Joseph, Benjamin, Jacob and Rahab.

What we are doing to make things better - We have opened the library bus, which gives children a place to read if they want to at break times. This will be used more and more in the future by different children.

Industrial Action – As you will be aware the NEU, one of the teaching unions has voted to strike over the next few months. We are currently looking at how this will affect us at St Barts and whether we will be able to keep every class open. Unfortunately, we are unable to confirm yet whether we will need to close any classes but we will keep you updated and will let you know as soon as we can. We appreciate this is a difficult time and you will be worried about work and childcare, if you have any questions please see Mrs Wainwright.

Safety Alert – We would like to remind you about the expectations around jewellery, in particularly earrings. If your child wears earrings, we ask that for school, they are small studs. In PE if your child cannot remove them themselves, we will use tape to cover them. If you could remove them in the morning on PE days that would be ideal. There has been an incident in a Leeds school recently where a child's ear was badly injured during a PE lesson when her earring was caught and her ear ripped.

We ask children do not come to school with necklaces/bracelets at all. These can often get broken or lost and are best kept safe at home. If they do we will ask them to take them off and they will be kept until the end of the day when they will be returned.

In PE, we will also ask that children tie up long hair, spare hair bands will be provided if needed. Again, this is for their safety. Tying hair up is also a good way to limit the chance of your child catching head lice, which can be a problem in schools.

Punctuality – The traffic around school is very busy at the moment, this is due to the roadworks in the local area, including the major work at Armley Gyratory. The weather at this time of year can also add to the problem. We ask that you account for this when travelling to school, this is important in the morning to make sure your child is not late for class and at the end of the day, including after school club. As you can appreciate, when parents are late to collect their children the staff are then late, and this can mean they are late collecting their own children or miss appointments. We would really appreciate your support with this. Thank you

Number Day - Friday 3rd February - We will be celebrating number day on Friday 3rd February. We will be doing lots of fun Maths activities in school. The day will be a non-uniform day and we are asking children to wear something with a number on if they have anything! We are also asking for a £1 donation that will go to the NSPCC.

Weekly Round Up

Nursery - The children love seeing what Jack Frost has been doing in our playground, turning everything white and making the grass crunchy. We have been on ice hunts, finding it in the tyres and the tuff trays. They all agreed the ice was freezing and that it made their hands very cold and they could not hold it for very long before their hands were freezing and red. We are still learning lots about penguins and have learnt this week about some penguins that do not live in the Antarctic but in the Falklands. There are five types of penguins there and we loved watching the Rock hopper Penguins who hop nimbly from one rock to another and have nests to live in and where their eggs hatch. https://falklandsconservation.com/penguins/

Reception – This week in Reception, we have continued to look at different animals. We have been thinking about which animal would make the best pet. We have been looking at where animals live. What they eat and how much exercise they need. The children have been interested in building this week in both the construction area, the box modelling area and outdoors. We would really appreciate any donations of boxes, lids and empty bottles for our models.

Year 1 & 2 – This week children in Year 1 have worked hard to write fact files about the Artic, focusing on interesting facts and the animals that live there. In Art, children have painted penguins in preparation for their sculpture work. In Year 2, children have enjoyed writing a fact file on The Great Fire of London, including features such as headings and subheadings. In Maths, they have explored money, looking at different coins and have added different amounts. We would like to remind parents/carers that children need to wear trainers on PE days and not boots. Thank you to all parents/carers for remembering to send children in their reading books and wordbooks.

Year 3 & 4 –This week, Year 4 have taken part in 'Bikeability' sessions in the playground with the cycling team at Leeds City Council. Some children learned to ride, whilst others improved their skills. In PE lessons, all children have been taking part in fitness classes and gymnastics. In English, we have carried on reading the Iron Man and have been rewriting key parts whilst learning new skills, such as fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases. In Maths, Class 10 have been looking at the method for multiplication. In History, we were amazed when we got the chance to study the oldest surviving note, written in Roman times.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In English, children have enjoyed developing their visualising techniques and investigating how different story starters hook readers. In Art, children have looked at tessellation and enjoyed creating their own tessellation designs. In Math's, children have looked at place value and related it to decimal places.
