Weekly Round Up

Reception – This week in Reception we have had been busy in the kitchen making our own pancakes and had even more fun tasting them! We have listened to the stories Mama Panya's Pancakes and Mr Wolf's Pancakes. We have worked really hard to write pancake instructions to share with the rest of school. In Maths, we have been throwing beanbags into hoops and adding the amounts together to find the total. We are looking forward to starting our new topic 'Where can we go and how can we get there '. Year 1 & 2 – Welcome back to a new and exciting half term. Spring is in the air and you will see that there are many planters in our playground. Children will be getting outside to plant a range of different garden plants, wild plants and vegetables, so they can see how they grow and learn about the different parts of a plant. This is part of our science curriculum and we really hope children enjoy seeing their flowers and vegetables grow over the spring and summer months. In Year 1 this week children have enjoyed the Garden Centre role-play areas and learning about the new topic of farming. We look forward to welcoming a mobile farm into school later in the term. In Year 2, children have started learning about the different London landmarks such as Buckingham Palace and The Houses of Parliament. They have evaluated different toy fire engines in their DT lessons before they make their own version later in the term.

Year 3 & 4 – This week, Years 3 and 4 have been starting to learn about how earthquakes are caused, as well as learning about the destruction they can cause. The children have been really grown up and showed great compassion when talking about recent events around the world, where earthquakes have caused lots of damage. We have also been reading a non-fiction book about earthquakes and volcanoes in English, to further our knowledge about this area of our Geography learning. In Maths, we have started to look at fractions. Please remember that children in Years 3 and 4 are encouraged to use times tables rockstars at home where they can, to support their rapid recall of multiplication facts.

Year 5 & 6 - Lessons - In PSHE, children have looked at stereotyping and recapped over the importance of good mental health. In Math's, children have been working on fractions, decimals and percentages. In English, children have enjoyed planning how to persuade Stanley's innocence from the book, Holes by Louis Sachar. Mr Needham has been very impressed with the effort of all classes in Years 5 and 6. Well done!
