Weekly Round Up

Reception – This week in Reception we have started our new topic 'where can we go and how can we get there' we looked at where we live and created maps of our local area. We have learnt that London is the capital city of England and we have used construction materials to build Big Ben, Tower Bridge and Buckingham Palace. In Maths, we have been learning the names of 2D shapes and talking about their properties. Next week we will be thinking about where else we can travel in the world and how different countries compare to where we live.

Year 1 & 2 — Children in classes 3, 4 and 5 have enjoyed learning the story of Jack and the Beanstalk in English lessons this week. The children have started to write their own character descriptions for the Giant and Jack using some imaginative adjectives. In Science, children have planted their own beanstalks and are observing how their plants grow over time. Children in classes 6 and 7 have investigated different toy fire engines in DT and have used junk modelling to look at the construction of the wheel axle and chassis. They will then use their ideas to make their own fire engine. In English, the children have really enjoyed the story 'A Walk In London'. They have used their inference skills to ask questions and use evidence from pictures to make suggestions to possible answers. In Maths, they have continued to use different pictorial methods to multiply and divide numbers and solve word problems.

Year 3 & 4 — This week the children have continued their topic on earthquakes and have been looking at the impact of the recent events in Turkey and Syria. In PE, they have developed their throwing and catching skills in netball and have learned how to perform a chest pass. In English and as part of World Book Day the children will be enjoying different fairy tales with a twist! They will be looking at well-known stories from the point of view of the villains and exploring alternative accounts of the same story - including different endings.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In Geography, children have enjoyed measuring the distance of volcanoes closest to the UK on a map. In Math's, children have been working on percentages. In English, children have enjoyed writing a setting description about the desert. In Religious Education, children have been learning about sacrifice and why Good Friday is named Good Friday.
