Weekly Round Up

Reception – The chicks have hatched! What an exciting few weeks we have had in Reception. We have loved watching the eggs hatch and the chicks grow. One of chicks made their entrance during our Phonics lesson and caused quite a stir! We have been drawing and painting pictures of the chicks and learning all about the life cycle of a chick and other animals. We have been using a range of natural materials to create nests for the chicks. It has been lovely to see the children reading and singing to the chicks and handling them carefully. As part of the St Barts Eurovision contest we have been working hard to learn the song 'Un Poco Loco'. We performed the songs on our outdoor stage and there was some amazing dancing and instrument playing. We think we may be in with a chance of winning. Fingers crossed! Year 1 & 2 -This week classes 3, 4 and 5 have been working super hard in Maths to find different fractions. They have understood what a quarter is and have found ¼ of a range of shapes, objects and amounts. In English, they have learnt a poem about African animals and have enjoyed performing this to different classes. In Science, the children have been learning about the diets of different animals and have used the words carnivore, herbivore and omnivore to describe each animal. Children in classes 6 and 7 have continued their topic of 'pirates' and have enjoyed reading The Pirates of Scurvy Sands'. They have designed their own pirate theme park based on the book and have written some impressive book reviews about their favourite Jonny Duddle pirate story. In History, the children have started to learn about Grace Darling and why she is remembered in History.

Year 3 & 4 - This week Years 3 and 4 have had an excellent week. We really enjoyed our trip to Yorkshire Sculpture Park. We had a tour of the grounds and were amazed by some of the sculptures we looked at. We then took part in a building workshop where we got to make our own sculptures in teams. Please see the website for pictures of these on our class pages. In school, we enjoyed starting to look at poetry, and enjoyed our murder mystery about who killed a Tudor called Lord Darnley.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In Geography, children have been learning about fair-trade and why it should be supported around the world. In Art, children have enjoyed completing their 'surreal art volcanoes.' In Music, children have enjoyed creating their own Eurovision music videos and judging the performances of other classes.
