**Nursery** - It has been wonderful to welcome our Nursery children and their families. The children have been settling in really well. We have been exploring both indoor and outdoor areas of the Nursery and getting to know each other. Reception – The children have settled really well into Reception and are already making some excellent friendships. We have been exploring the environment this week, selecting our own resources for tasks and working hard to tidy up when we have finished. We are using a little saying to help us remember to keep our classrooms tidy, 'choose it, use it, put it away '. We have been reading lots of different stories about what makes us unique and have been looking in the mirror and talking about similarities and differences. We have enjoyed creating self-portraits and have tried hard to use the correct shapes for our face, eyes, nose and mouth. We have enjoyed talking about where we live and whom we live with. Year 1 & 2 — What a flying start we have had to the new school year. All children have settled in superbly and have impressed us all with their fantastic learning attitudes. Last week the Years 1 and 2 newsletter went home with children so hopefully parents and carers are all aware of our homework procedures and opportunities. Please see a member of staff if you still have any questions as there is always a lot to remember at the start of term. We would also like to remind everyone that on PE day's children need to come to school in PE kit. This should include trainers in order to keep children safe when they are running and that jewellery, skirts and dresses should not be worn on these days. Year 1 have really enjoyed their first book of the year - The Highway Rat by Julia Donaldson. The children have loved writing about him and playing in the Highway Rat's Bakery. In Year 2, children have started their work on castles and learning about the Normans. Children have learnt some really tricky vocabulary to describe the different parts of a castle and have used these to label their castle diagrams. Can we end by saying a huge thankyou to all parents and carers who have sent their children to school with their reading book every day. This has really helped us when hearing children read.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have been reading the story 'Oliver Twist' by Charles Dickins. This links with our History topic all about the Victorians, which we are currently learning about. We have been looking at living conditions and various diseases that made people ill during this time. In our French lessons, we have been learning about classroom commands in year 3 and body parts in year 4. Year 3 have also started their ukulele lessons. Last term, we sent out a letter of interest about the children going to see the 'Oliver Twist' musical at the West Yorkshire Playhouse. We are very excited to tell parents that we have managed to secure a grant for the cost of this, so the trip will be free for families! Thanks to all of the parents who sent a reply in, and a permission letter will be coming out nearer the time.

**Year 5 & 6 – Lessons** - In English, children have been writing from the perspective of the sea when the Titanic sank. In Science, children have been learning about the Solar System, the eight planets and facts about them. In History, children have enjoyed learning about the Magna Carta and if it is a significant historical document.
