## Weekly Round Up

**Nursery** -In Nursery this week, we continued to get to know each other and make new friends. We have shared some of our family photographs which children enjoyed doing. Thank you again to all the parents who sent in the photographs. We also looked at each other in the mirrors and learnt how to describe each other, who we are and what we look like. The children even had a go at drawing their self-portraits. We learnt a few songs: 'Head and shoulders' and 'If you're happy and you know it' and we are sure children will be very happy to sing them with you at home.

**Reception** – This week in Reception, we have been continuing to think about ourselves. We have listened to lots of different all about me stories and have finished drawing our self-portraits looking closely in the mirror at our features. We have been naming our body parts and have enjoyed singing head shoulder knees and toes and replacing the body parts each verse. Our favourite version was back, eyebrow, elbow, and chin. We have been having many chats about our school rules and we have been making some class promises. The children are working really hard to listen when others are speaking, keep our classroom tidy and be kind to others.

**Year 1 & 2** –This week children in Year 1 have been reading the story of The Three Little Pigs. They have looked at different types of houses the pigs built and have started to write sentences to match. In our provision areas, children have enjoyed being estate agents and selling different types of houses to each other. In Year 2, the children have been looking at representing different two digit numbers using both base 10 and through drawing their own pictures. We have added some photos to the website of the great Maths they have been doing. In PE the sports coach has been introducing children to the sport of handball. They have been practising different types of throw such as the underarm and chest pass. Please can children come in their PE kits on PE days - all children have been provided with a red T-shirt. Then either tracksuit bottoms, shorts or leggings and trainers need to be worn.

**Year 3 & 4** - This week, we have continued to read the story 'Oliver Twist'. Year 4 have been writing direct speech from the story, using inverted commas to punctuate appropriately. In Maths, we have continued our focus on place value. In our History lessons, we have been looking at what a rich and poor house looked like during Victorian times, ahead of our trip to Armley Mills later in the term. Please ensure you return your letters as soon as possible. In Art, we have continued to look at LS Lowry and his famous street scenes and matchstick men. In PSHE, we have been looking at democracy and what the government does. Please ensure your child brings their reading book to school everyday. There have been lots of children not bringing them in regularly and this means reading time is used up getting new books. Well done to all of the children who brought their homework in on Friday. Please remember that Maths homework books need bringing into school on a Friday and children must complete their spelling task on Emile. We appreciate your support with this.

Year 5 & 6 – <u>Lessons</u>: In Art, children have been learning about different graffiti art and practicing their own graffiti art. In Science, children have been looking at Geocentric versus Heliocentric. In History, children have enjoyed learning about the pilgrimage of Grace and whether it was successful activism.
