Worship – Our current theme is <u>Thankfulness</u> and this week we have continued to look at the world we live in and what we should be thankful for.

Health and Safety Reminder – We would like to remind you about the expectations around jewellery, in particularly earrings. If your child wears earrings, we ask that for school, they are small studs. In PE if your child cannot remove them themselves, we will use tape to cover them. If you could remove them in the morning on PE days that would be ideal. There have been incidents in Leeds schools where children's ears were badly injured during PE lessons when their earring was caught and their ear ripped. We also ask that children do not wear jewellery to school, we have had incidents where bracelets/necklaces etc have been broken or lost and this is upsetting for your child and you, especially if it was expensive.

If your child is in Reception or Years 1 and 2 remember that, your child is entitled to a free school meal. If they normally have packed lunch and you would like them to try a school dinner on that day please ask at the office. It is completely free!



If your child is in KS2 and is entitled to benefits related free school meals but usually has packed lunch, why not let them try a free school dinner on the themed day? Just complete the form or ask at the office.

If your child normally has packed lunch and would like a dinner on this day, please order and pay at the office by Monday 2nd October, and inform us of any allergies. The cost is £2, unless paying for something else at the same time we can only accept cash. You can see the Menu on our website and in the notice boards.

Attendance – Coming to school every day is vital if children are to achieve their best in school. Weekly Round Up

Nursery - This week we have been looking at different families and patterns in Nursery. We have read the book: 'My mum and dad make me laugh' by Nick Sharratt and we talked to the children about emotions. We shared what makes us happy and sad and it was great to hear all the examples from children of what makes them happy/sad. We have been also developing our gross motor skills by dancing with scarves and ribbons as well as throwing/catching/kicking balls, and jumping/hopping over the obstacles in the outdoor area (definitely a great work out for us all this week ①)

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been talking about our families. We have been listening to lots of stories about different families and talking about how all families are different. We have been using lollipop sticks to create houses and working hard to draw our families inside. During our carpet sessions, we have been reading many stories about feelings and what we can do to help us feel better when we are angry or upset.

Year 1 & 2 — We have had a very busy week this week in Key Stage 1 with lots of exciting learning going on. All the children really enjoyed the visit from the author in our new library. Check out the website for photos. The children in Year 1 have enjoyed their art lessons this week where they have been sketching self-portraits. The children have been exploring their senses in Science and went on a listening walk around school to record the different sounds they could hear. In Year 2, the children have experimented with colour mixing in art and have been completing colour wheels. In History, they have looked closely at old buildings in Leeds such as Kirkstall Abbey, before they learn about different castles and when they were built.

Please can all children remember to bring in their yellow reading record books to show us the super reading they have done at home. Children who bring these in with comments from home will be awarded with track-it points.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have been looking at biographies. We have starting to look at what they are and the features of them. In History, we are looking at crimes from the Victorian era, as well as what punishments were given to these criminals! In Science, we are investigating how far sounds can travel. In French, we are recognising words and applying our knowledge we have built up so far. Children have also been given a login for Duolingo, which is an app that supports French language development. Mr Waters would like to thank all of the families who completed homework last week. Unfortunately, there were quite a few children who did not complete all tasks. Please ensure homework is completed by a Friday as this is the day where it is checked/marked.

Year 5 & 6 Lessons: Years 5 and 6 have thoroughly enjoyed their author workshops in the recently launched library. Children are now looking forward to visiting the library and choosing their own book. In swimming, children are working hard developing their swimming skills. In English, children have been developing their inference skills whilst reading 'I survived the sinking of the Titanic, 1912.' In Art, children have enjoyed making stencils and creating their pictures from it.

PE and Swimming: A reminder that children should be wearing their PE kits (including red t-shirt) when it is PE. Children should be wearing school uniform on the day they go swimming.
