Weekly Round Up

Nursery - This week we have started learning about Autumn. We have read 'Owl babies' story, which children really enjoyed. We have learnt Autumn songs about falling leaves and looked at different autumn objects (leaves, conkers, pine cones and sticks). We made nature patterns and made/painted lovely owls. We even gave the leaves a haircut. Thank you to all who brought some leaves and conkers from your Autumn walks. In phonics, we explored the objects that make sounds and we sang a song: 'Mrs Brown has a box'.

Reception – In Reception this week we have been talking about where we live and who we live with. We have enjoyed looking at photos of our homes that was shared on learning journals and have used them to draw and paint pictures. Next week we will be creating maps of our local area. Thank you to everyone who is completing home learning challenges. If you need support with learning journals please see Mrs Ingleson.





Year 1 & 2 – This week the children in Year 1 have been reading the story 'Inside the Villains' looking at the different villains from fairy tales. They have focused closely on The Big Bad Wolf from the story they read last week of The Three Little Pigs. The children have enjoyed creating their own villain and writing a wanted poster for them. In provision, they are still enjoying being estate agents and have looked at selling spooky houses that the villains live in. Children in Year 2 have enjoyed reading the story of Rapunzel following the author visit last week. They have read different versions of the same story and have focused on statements, questions and exclamations in their writing. In Science, the children have conducted their own investigations into which mate rial is the best at blocking out light.

We seem to be collecting quite a lot of unnamed uniform such as jumpers and cardigans. Each week any items collected will be on display outside the class 4 shelter - please check if anything belongs to your child. To help with this please can all school uniform be named so that any lost items can be returned to their owner.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have continued to look at biographies in English, looking more about the life of Charles Dickins. In Science, we have been looking at how sounds travel and completed an investigation into how different animal ear shapes can vary how sounds are heard. In History, we have been looking at how Victorians were punished if they broke any laws, and in particular looking at people who were sent to Australia for their crimes. In Maths, Year 4 have been looking at negative numbers.

Year 5 & 6- <u>Lessons</u>: In English, we have been working on flashbacks: planning and writing them. We have also completed a reciprocal read on Chapter 10 of 'I survived the sinking of the Titanic, 1912.' In Art, we have been thinking about words/phrases we will be using in our word art.

Homework: We are really happy with the effort and application children are putting into their homework. All children in Year 5 and 6 also have the opportunity to attend homework club every Monday and Thursday lunchtimes. Please keep encouraging your children to complete their homework.
