Weekly Round Up

Nursery - This week we have been celebrating Black History Month. We have talked about inspirational people. We have learnt that amber traffic light has been invented by Garret Morgan. We have learnt 'traffic lights' song and played traffic lights game. We looked at traditional clothes and food. We would like to thank all the parents who sent in the photographs as well as 'greetings' in their home languages - the children enjoyed sharing them with their peers and grown-ups. We have read 'Handa's Surprise' and tasted delicious exotic fruit. We have learnt 'African drum' song and explored African drums 'djembe'. The children also enjoyed moving to African beats. We have made lovely colourful necklaces and did observational drawings and paintings of fruit.

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been talking about the changes in our environment. We have been creating lots of Autumn artwork and have been exploring leaves, conkers pumpkins and acorns. We have enjoyed rolling conkers down the drainpipes and talking about who has more and who has fewer. We have been asking many questions about nocturnal animals and are looking forward to learning more about hedgehogs next week.

Year 1 & 2 — This week the children in Year 1 have been creative and have enjoyed making their own skeletons and looking at different X-rays to see what our different body parts look like. Through reading story of Funny Bones, the children have been writing about the house the skeletons lived in and how it compares to their own house. Children in Year 2 have investigated 3D shapes in Maths looking at the names and features of the different shapes. In English they have been comparing the 2 different characters of Rapunzel and The Paper Bag Princess and have used the conjunction 'but' to show how they are different. All children in Year 2 will have received their Skipton Castle trip letter. Please can you check your child's book bag if you have not received a letter. As the weather is getting cooler please can all children come to school in suitable, named clothing for cold weather including a coat and on PE days a jumper as well as their red PE top.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have been continuing our work on play scripts in English. Last week we looked at the features of layout of them, and this week, we wrote our own based on Oliver Twist. In science and history, we have been reviewing our learning on sound and the Victorians. Classes 8 and 9 have also attended Armley Mills. The children had a great day in role as Victorian children at school. The schools were very strict and it helped us with our understanding of what it would have been like in that era.

Year 5 & 6- <u>Lessons:</u> In Geography, we have started our topic 'What is a river?' We have investigated the water cycle. In Art, we received a video message from the Bartsy Banksy setting us a children: to create a piece of activism art to be put up around school! In swimming, we cannot believe we have been going for six weeks – we are all working hard developing our swimming skills! Swimming lessons are still taking place next week.
