# <u>URGENT IF YOUR CHILD ATTENDS ASC/BC OR HAS PAID SCHOOL</u> LUNCHES please read this message from Mrs Wainwright

Late Payments – We do not like to continually ask for payments for after school club, breakfast club and school lunches but we need these paying on a Monday, either before school or at 3.20pm at the end of the day. You could always pay on a Friday for the next week or pay in advance. We allocate Monday for processing the payments and banking any money. It takes a considerable amount of time to do this and the staff in the office have too much to do to continue chasing payments and we cannot run these provisions if parents do not pay. We no longer accept payments after 3.30pm in ASC because all the staff are with the children and they cannot keep leaving ASC to take payments. If we need to allocate a member of staff to take payments, we would have to reduce the number of children we offer a place to.

From January, we will withdraw your child's place if you pay late and <u>you will have to find alternative arrangements</u>. If you do not pay for lunches, we will ask you to provide a packed lunch for your child. It is also unacceptable that a few parents become upset and angry with the office staff for asking for late payments. Please see me if you want to discuss anything.

It is with great sadness that I am now considering closing these provisions or handing them over to a private company in September. I personally set BC/ASC up over 20 years ago as I believed in providing you cheap/affordable childcare in a provision run by school staff just for our children. However, it is now becoming too difficult to manage the many late payments every week.

## Weekly Round Up

**Nursery** - In Nursery, we have been learning about birthdays. We have read 'Kipper's Birthday' and made lots of birthday artwork (decorated cakes and painted balloons). We looked at Mystery Balloons and tried to guess what was inside them. We wrote birthday cards and explored water beads in the water tray. The children had decorated the birthday biscuits and enjoyed eating them after we had a little birthday dancing party for Kipper. Apart from birthdays, we have also learnt positional language and in phonics, we listened to noises The Noisy Neighbour made.

**Reception** – This week in Reception, we have been listening to the story The Gingerbread Man. We have enjoyed making salt dough gingerbread people to turn into Christmas tree decorations in the next few weeks. We have used puppets and masks to retell the story and have made our own stick people and playdough characters from the story. We have been very busy mathematicians this week and have been exploring different ways to make cubes. We have printed, collaged, drawn and used cubes to show different ways of making 4. Please see learning journals for photos. We are working hard on our Christmas concert and there is a lot for us to remember. Please practice any lines your child has at home using a loud voice.

Year 1 & 2 – In Maths Year 1 have been learning about shape, they have learnt the names of 2D and 3D shapes and have been matching the names to the shapes in provision. In Science they have continued to learn about materials thinking about their properties and in Geography, Year 1 have compared the Antarctic and the Arctic. They looked at the different animals that could be found in each place and discovered that the Artic is made of ice and so melts. Year 2 have started reading Voices in the Park by Anthony Brown in English, pupils will be comparing characters and have been working really hard on using the conjunctions of but and because. In Math's pupils have continued building their knowledge of basic functions using ten frames to add and subtract, first practically, then pictorially. In computing pupils have been programmers, writing algorithms and de-bugging them when they don't work properly, pupils independence has really improved in programming already this half term.

**Year 3 & 4 -** This week, Years 3 and 4 have been busy practising our Christmas production. We have been learning our lines and learning songs ready to perform in a few weeks. Year 4 have been practising all of their times tables in maths, and in RE, we have been looking at special places in the community. In computing lessons, we have started to design our times table games on scratch and in science we have continued to learn about solids, liquids and gases. We have had fun rewriting and redrafting our scary stories in English lessons.

**Year 5 & 6 - Lessons:** In English, we have been writing our own scary stories. In Geography, we completed a debate on whether the Three Gauges Dam has a positive or negative effect on the world. In Science, we have completed our own parachute investigation testing air resistance.

**Math's City** - A group of Year 6 children (with Miss Christie and Mr Middleton) visited Math's City in the Trinity Centre and thoroughly enjoyed their time. Children had to complete practical investigations and well done to Bryan who was the overall winner of the visit!

**Homework** - A reminder that homework is now set on a Monday and the deadline for completing homework will be the following Monday. Children who do not complete their homework will be expected to attend Homework Club on a Monday lunchtime.

**Year 6 SATs Week** - A reminder that Year 6 SATs week will begin on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024. It is vital that all children in Year 6 attend school that week. The test timetable will be as follows:
