Weekly Round Up

Nursery - We have been excited to welcome all the children back after Christmas break. Our topic for this half term is 'The world around us' and our main focus is Winter and arctic animals. In the first week back we have been talking about winter season, how the weather has changed, what clothes we should be wearing when going outside and what happens to the animals during winter. This week we looked at penguins, where they live, what they look like and what they do. We explored ice both indoors and outdoors. In phonics, we started looking at our names and practised copying initial sounds. We also looked at rhyme and sang lots of rhyme songs, read rhyming stories and tried to find rhyming friends. In Maths, we did lots of counting, found matching gloves. We also looked at new concepts: floating and sinking. Our role-play turned into the South Pole, where children wear hats and gloves to keep themselves warm, build igloos and do fishing.

Reception –This week in Reception, we have begun our new topic where can we go and how can we get there? We have been recapping where we live and finding Leeds on the map. We have been talking about England and the capital city. We have been asking questions about what we would like to find out about London and the landmarks. Many children have been using blocks to create London landmarks and comparing them to some of the buildings we have seen in our city. We are looking forward to learning more about London next week. If you have ever been to London, please send pictures to Learning Journals.

Year 1 & 2 - This week the children in Year 1 have really enjoyed learning different poems about the season of winter. They have been learning how to retrieve information from the poems and answer questions about them. The children have used their oracy skills to practise and perform the poems, thinking about how they use their voice to be heard. In Year 2, the children have started their topic on the Great fire of London and have studied poems written about this event. They have looked at the meanings of old language and used their inference skills to say what lines in the poem are referring to. We were very impressed as the children then wrote their own senses poem based on The Great Fire of London.

Year 3 & 4 – Over the past two weeks, we have started a new topic, learning about the Stone Age. In English, Year 3 have been reading the story 'Stone Age Boy', and Year 4 have been reading Kensuke's Kingdom. In History, we found out more about the Stone Age era by dissecting 'poo', as well as looking at changes over the period of time. This term in PE, we have starting our new topics: Fitness and gymnastics. In PSHE, we are learning all about healthy and unhealthy foods that we eat, as well as learning about ethical farming.

Years 3 and 4 Bikeability - Unfortunately the team that run our sessions have delayed the sessions. The new dates will be Monday 18th March - Thursday 21st March. All signed letters will be used for the new dates. Thank you for your understanding.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In History, we have started our topic of the Viking and learning about the raid on Lindisfarne. In English, we have been enjoyed writing an explanation text on the water cycle.

Homework - A reminder that homework is now set on a Monday and the deadline for completing homework will be the following Monday. Children who do not complete their homework will be expected to attend Homework Club on a Monday lunchtime.
