Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

If you are eligible for free school meals this could save you £420.00 per year. To apply for free school meals you can follow the link below:

Well done and thank you to all the children, supported by their parents and carers who come to school every day unless they are really unwell and have fantastic attendance.

We are concerned about the number of children not in school on certain days, including Fridays when attendance drops, (It is not the weekend! I wish it was!) and when the weather is poor, including very cold, rainy and windy. We need to prepare our children for their future where they will not be able to just stay off work because of the weather or because it is Friday. Please help us with this as children can only learn when in school on time and absences affects their learning and can impact their mental wellbeing.

Weekly Round Up

Nursery - In Nursery this week, we have continued with our topic of winter and arctic animals. Our book of the week has been 'Polar Bear Polar Bear what do you hear?' and we have sung a new song: '5 little polar bears'. In Maths we have learnt the words describing the positions of objects (in, on, behind, next to, under). In phonics, we identified animal sounds and played silly soup game focussing on rhyming words. We are really impressed with children who can recognise the rhyme in some of the words. Next week we will continue with our Polar Bear book and rhyming words.

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been learning more about the London landmarks. We have enjoyed learning about Tower Bridge, Big Ben, Buckingham Palace and the London Eye. One of our favourite parts of the week was working with a partner to build a bridge over a river on the carpet. We had to talk to each other and work out the best way to do it. There was some excellent teamwork in both classes! We made the most of the weather this week and were using powder paints outside to explore colour mixing. When it was windy, we made kites and enjoyed making them fly in the outdoor area.

Year 1 & 2 - This week children in Year 1 have studied the Antarctic Expedition by Robert Falcon Scott and have sequenced the different events of the journey. They learned that there was a man called Captain Oates on the expedition who was from Leeds and there is a memorial dedicated to him in Meanwood Park. Children in Year 2 have continued to investigate The Great Fire of London. They have identified the conditions needed at the time for the fire to spread so quickly and have discussed their opinions about which they think was the most important factor. We have some exciting experiences planned this half term: Year 1 are having a workshop delivered by Dan-tastic Education where they will be having a Polar Explorer's Workshop. Year 2 are going back in time to the Great Fire of London and will be participating in an exciting workshop where they meet Sir William Petty (a person from 1666) and will look at investigating the Great Fire of London. We would really appreciate the £3 contribution towards these workshops, as without them the day wouldn't be possible. Thank you so much to those parents who have already sent their contribution into school!

Year 3 & 4 – This week, Year 4 have started writing our own adventure story, based on Kensuke's Kingdom. Year 4 have started to read Stig of the dump, and comparing the main character to Stone Age Boy. In PSHE, we have been looking at Fairtrade foods, and how they help the people who make these products. In History, we enjoyed investigating a site near Scarborough, where lots of Stone Age artifacts were once found. In Science, we created a graph to show the results from last week's experiment where we tested how quickly ice melted.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In History, we have looked into the reasons why the Vikings settled in England. In English, we completed work on present, perfect tense and plan a non-chronological report on the Vikings. In Science, we have been planning an investigation on how salt affects ice.

Homework - A reminder that homework is now set on a Monday and the deadline for completing homework will be the following Monday. Children who do not complete their homework will be expected to attend Homework Club on a Monday lunchtime.

Year 6 SATs briefing - We will be holding a SATs information evening for parents/carers on Wednesday 31st January. The event will start at 6pm and will last no longer than one hour.
