Weekly Round Up

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been talking about mental health and wellbeing. We have been engaging in lots of calming activities such as yoga, meditation and breathing exercises. We have listened to lots of stories about feelings and talked about what we can do when we are feeling sad angry or worried. We have enjoyed setting up a calm area in the classroom and have spent time playing in the water tray with relaxing bubble and playing in the playdough area with lavender and rose petals.

Year 1 & 2 - What an exciting week children in Year 1 have had. They really enjoyed their visit from Dan-Tastic on Tuesday where they took part in an explorer's workshop. They investigated what an explorer is and looked at those who had explored the Arctic and Antarctic. The children loved handling the different artefacts and joining in the fun activities. In Year 2 this week, the children have challenged themselves in reading to sequence the story of Toby and The Great Fire of London. They have been able to understand the events of the story and use these as a structure for writing their own version. In Math's, children have used pictoral methods to begin to divide numbers. They have worked in pairs to share amounts and understand that when you divide whole numbers the answer becomes smaller.

Year 3 & 4 – This week, Years 3 and 4 have enjoyed performing the poem 'Walking with my iguana'. It has a great beat and we enjoyed adding actions and changing our voices. In History, we have been looking at hill forts, which were settlements on hills. We discussed why this was beneficial. In Art, we have finished our dreamcatchers. During our PE lessons, we have seen how much our fitness has improved and in RE we have been looking at diversity and kindness. We hope all of the children have a lovely half term holiday.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In History, we have enjoyed learning about Alfred the Great and thinking about whether his impact really was great. In English, we have been writing our non-chronological reports on The Vikings. In Art, we have been working on our sea creatures using recycled plastic!
