# **Weekly Round Up**

**Nursery** - Our topic this half term is 'Adventures above and below the clouds'. In Nursery this week, we have been reading 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We turned our role-play area into bear's cottage with three different sized beds, chair and bowls. We have been scooping porridge and filling different sized containers with it. In Maths, we looked at sizes and weight. In phonics, we have continued with rhyming words and we have learnt a new song 'When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears'. We have also been building cottages and painted bears.

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been learning about how people across the world celebrate Lunar New Year. We found Asia on the map and looked closely at photos of China, talking about how it is different from where we live. We decorated our home corner and the children were keen to clean the house just as we had watched happen on a video showing Lunar New Year preparations. We have really enjoyed learning a Chinese New Year song and playing along with instruments. We have been getting creative and making lanterns, dragons and other decorations. In Maths we have been learning about 3d shape. We have worked hard to remember their name and we have used them to make towers, hunted for real life 3d shapes and used playdough to make our own spheres and cubes.

Year 1 & 2 -Welcome back to a new and exciting half term! In Year 1, children have started their new topic of Roots, Shoots and Muddy Boots. The children will be learning about life on a farm and about growing plants in Science. This week the children have enjoyed their role-play area of a garden centre and explored different types of plants. They have acted out life on the farm in their small world area and have started the story of Jack and The Beanstalk. In Year 2 this half term, children will be exploring the topic of Bright Lights Big City. They will be looking closely at their local area and the wider city of Leeds. This week the children have been celebrating kindness through reading the story 'The Kindest Red'. They have thought about how they can be kind and what things would make a kind world for everyone to live in. The children thought about how Leeds is a diverse city with people from many different cultures and how lucky we are to have friends from a range of different cultures.

**Year 3 & 4** –Years 3 and 4 have enjoyed reading poems about morals. We used our reading strategies to help us understand unknown words and to make predictions. In Maths, we have been learning about length and perimeter. We have also started our new DT topic, where we will be learning cutting skills and cooking this half term. In Science, we have been learning about human teeth and what they are called. We looked at what purpose they all have.
