Attendance – Remember there is a chance for children to win prizes for being in school every Friday this half term, for being in school every day in the last week of term and for having attendance over 96% this half term. All children with excellent attendance this term will receive a prize and certificate at Easter.

Worship – Our current theme is Justice and this week we have continued to discuss whether justice and fairness means everyone should be treated exactly the same.

**Ramadan – Fasting** - If you require your child to fast as part of your religious observance, this must be put in writing and discussed with school. This is important so we can make sure children are safe. Thank you.

Governors Update - The governors are a group of people who work together to support and challenge school to make sure we are doing things correctly and for the benefit of our children. They are not involved in the day-to-day running of the school but have an oversight of what we do. They are made up of parents, church representatives, and people from the local community and school staff. Uniform - It is fantastic to see our children in their uniform when they come to school. Please remember we have some expectations around what children wear for PE. They should come in:

- A black or grey tracksuit, jogging bottoms, shorts or leggings
- Their red plain t-shirt. Each child will receive one from school. This must only be worn on PE days. If you • need another one we sell spare ones at the office for £1. (Please be aware they may not be red but old style school t-shirts. These are acceptable.
- Trainers can be worn ٠
- A suitable top, black or red hoodie or black or red tracksuit top for if it is colder outside.

Jewellery - Should not be worn for school and if children wear earrings, they must be small studs. This is for health and safety reasons and children and parents will be upset if jewellery is lost or broken.

#### Weekly Round Up

**Nursery** - In Nursery this week we continued to read 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears'. We have retold the story using story map and masks. The children really enjoy acting out the story in the role-play area and it is lovely to hear them using exact phrases from the book. On Wednesday, we tasted porridge. Some children loved it and some were no so keen on it. We all had a chance to say if we liked the porridge or not and why. We have also talked about healthy and unhealthy food and sorted the food into these two categories. In phonics we have learnt new song: 'Stir up the Porridge' and played rhyming games: 'What's in the bag?' In Maths, we continued to talk about sizes and made patterns with colourful bears. We have been looking at Kandinsky's art this week and on the creative table, we tried to create our own 'Squares with Concentric Circles' using paint, collage and oil pastels.

**Reception** – This week in Reception, we have been learning about different places around the world. We have been looking closely at photos of the natural wonders of the world and created some amazing artwork. Next week we will be looking at animals around the world and talking about whether they live in a hot or cold place. On Tuesday, we had a visit from the story bus. The children listen to a story on the bus, sang songs and spent time sharing books with their friends

**Year 1 & 2** -In Year 1 this week in Maths the children have been investigating numbers to 50. They have used a range of methods to partition the different numbers into tens and ones in different ways. They have been challenged to place numbers on a number line and find one more and one less than numbers to 50. In Year 2 this week, the children have been recapping addition and subtraction in Maths. They have been revising the different written methods we use to solve some tricky calculations such as 43+24= and 65 - 33=.

Thank you to all families in Year 1 who have already returned their child's reply slip and contribution for Cannon Hall Farm. The children (and staff) are very excited about the visit.

**Year 3 & 4** – This week, Years 3 and 4 have been looking at the differences between human and animal teeth. We have been looking at the purpose of different animal teeth and how this helps them. In basketball, we have been practising our dribbling skills. We also investigated different climate zones in the world, and how the equator changes weather patterns. This follows on from our work on UK climate last week.

**Tropical World** - Please return your letter if you have not already. The trips start next week and it is important that children are sent in with appropriate outdoor clothing and shoes, as part of the trip will be outdoors (weather permitting). Please also send lunches in a throwaway bag so that children do not have to carry these. Children MUST be in school uniform.

**Year 5 & 6 – Lessons** - In English, we have started looking at speech and how to use dialogue effectively in our writing. In Geography, we have looked at bush fires and investigated why insurance is so expensive in areas prone to bush fires.
