


## Headteachers Awards – Well done to the children who have had a great week in school.

#### Weekly Round Up

**Nursery** - This week we have continued to read 'Whatever next' story. We used pictures to retell it and acted it out in our role-play area. We have opened Space Cafe where children prepared Spider Soup, Slimey Spaghetti and Slug Shake - yummy. We talked to the children about activities we do at night and during daytime. In phonics, we have been learning a new sound 'a' and revised previous sound 's'. We have also learnt new song: '5 little men in a flying saucer'.

**Reception** – This week in Reception, we had a visit from the Teddy Bear Hospital. We took our teddies to the hall and learnt all about what happens at the doctors and hospital. We talked about healthy and unhealthy food, looking after our teeth and learnt some simple first aid. We looked at doctor's equipment and looked after a giant teddy! Look out for photos on the website and learning Journals. We have also been learning about Ramadan this week and Miss Khan has been sharing her experiences.

## Year 1 & 2 - What an exciting week we have had in Key Stage 1!

Year 1 had an amazing time on their visit to Cannon Hall Farm. They saw a wide range of different animals including sheep, goats, horses, ferrets and reptiles. They learnt about life on a farm and how to look after the different animals. It was lovely seeing the signs of Spring with flowers blooming and lambs being born The children remembered so many facts about farms that they have been learning this half term - see the website for photos of the visits. In Year 2 the children went on a mini-bus tour of Leeds to see some of the main landmarks in the city. They visited Elland Road Stadium, the recycling centre, the market, Leeds Arena and the Town Hall. The children loved their tour and have written some detailed descriptions of the places they saw.

**Year 3 & 4** – This week, Year 4 have enjoyed publishing their survival guide leaflets, about how to survive in the Amazon Rainforest. Year 4 also enjoyed their bikeability sessions, where many children learned to ride, whilst other has better and more confident. In geography, we have been looking at how certain environments suit different plants and animals around the world. In RE we have been learning more about Islam. Years 3 and 4 would like to say a big thankyou to one of our parents Mrs Alnen, who came in to teach us about Ramadan last week.

**Year 5 & 6 – Lessons** - In RE, we have enjoyed completing an oracy lesson on forgiveness. In English, we have started our balanced arguments and we have continued reading Song of the Dolphin Boy. In DT, we have been completing our 'Bridges Challenge – the longest, strongest bridge!'

**Swimming** - There will be no swimming lessons next week. Swimming lessons will start again in the week beginning 22<sup>nd</sup> April.

**Homework** - A reminder that homework is now set on a Monday and the deadline for completing homework will be the following Monday. Children who do not complete their homework will be expected to attend Homework Club on a Monday lunchtime.
