#### Weekly Round Up

**Nursery** - This week in Nursery, we have been learning about plants/flowers. We have learnt words describing parts of a plant: root, stem, leaf, and flower. We have looked at different types of flower names (poppy, snowdrop, bluebell, dandelion, etc.). We have planted some more beans and some pansies in our plant pots outside - we will continue to add more pots to it for children to observe growing and to look after them. We have opened the gravel pit outside which currently is our construction site and the children love exploring it. We have been revising 2D shapes and to extend it we would like to ask you to take the children on a shape hunt either at home or in the local area. We would love to see pictures of the shapes you found with your child.

**Reception** – This week in Reception, we have been planting beans! We have been talking about what they will need to grow and have been watering them all week and checking for shoots. We were excited to see our cress begin to grow and have talked about the changes we can see. We have talked about where fruit and veg grows and have learnt all about the journey of a banana across the world and into our supermarket. We have talked about food that is grown in England and have started thinking about farms and why they are important. Next week our chick eggs will be arriving. We cannot wait to watch them hatch!

**Year 1 & 2** - This week in PSHE children in Year 1 have been looking at 'Big Feelings' and how some feelings are stronger than others. They have read a story about a character called Maz and had to use clues in the story to identify that Maz was feeling angry. Children then talked about how they could manage the feeling of anger and related this to their own experiences. In Year 2 the children have been learning about weaving as part of their Art lessons. They have studied Lucy Poskitt and have looked at her artwork. Children have made their own looms and have used different materials such as crepe paper and wool to create repeated patterns using weaving techniques.

**Year 3 & 4** –This week, Years 3 and 4 have been using sources of evidence to learn about the afterlife in Ancient Egyptian times. In English, Year 4 have been writing explanations and Year 3 have been reading about the pyramids. In PSHE, we have been learning how to deal with an emergency and who to ring if we needed urgent help. In RE, we have been practising our presenting skills by sharing with our class all that we now know about the five pillars of Islam.

**Year 5 & 6 – Lessons -** In History, we have looked at how the Roman Gods are similar to Greek Gods. In Religious Education, we have been looking at the reasons why you might feel good about confessing to things.

**Homework** - A reminder that the deadline for homework will be Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> May. Children are expected to complete their Emile activities and to complete thirty minutes on Reading Plus.

Year 6 SATs Week - We now have one week in school to go before SATs week.

6 SATs week will begin on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024. It is vital that all children in Year 6 attend school that week. The test timetable will be as follows:
