Weekly Round Up

Nursery - We cannot believe it is the last week of summer half term. This week we have been reading The Very Hungry Caterpillar story and learnt about butterfly life cycle. We sorted the fruit into right colour bowls and made pattern caterpillars. We printed some caterpillars and made them using cubes and playdough. We learnt how to make symmetry butterflies - the children really loved this activity. We had lovely conversations about favourite fruit from the story and revised healthy and unhealthy food. We hope our children have a lovey break!

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been continuing to learn about life cycles of living things. We have been sequencing the life cycle of a caterpillar and drawing some beautiful butterflies. We have learnt the word chrysalis and have been working hard to use it in focus tasks and when playing in provision. On Tuesday we had a fantastic visit from cooking in the classroom. We made a gruffalo crumble! The children listened carefully and followed instructions, washing their hands, cutting the fruit and mixing the crumble. We loved eating it at the end of the session!

Year 1 & 2 – This week the children in Year 1 have been exploring non-fiction texts about African animals in English. They have looked at features such as the contents page, headings, pictures and a glossary. Children have worked hard to write their own information about Cheetahs. In Year 2, the children have really enjoyed poetry this week and have learned about riddles and how to write them. The children have looked at the layout of these types of poems and have written their own about objects relating to the topic of pirates. All children have enjoyed the Pirate Day see the website for pictures of the wonderful activities the children took part in.

Year 3 & 4 – This week, Years 3 and 4 have been looking at explanation texts. Year 3 enjoyed looking at life cycles and answering questions about the text. In RE, we have been learning about Guru Nanak and his life. Class 11 and 12 have also enjoyed their trip to Harlow Carr, where they did some geography fieldwork and looked at the amazing plants that grow there. In art, we have finished our collages using the range of skills we have learned this term.

Year 5 & 6 – Thank-you to all children for their hard work this half term.

The children in Year 6 have plenty to look forward to now that SATs is over, including their trip to Flamingo Land. A reminder that we are taking voluntary contributions for Flamingo Land – we would really appreciate voluntary donations from all children.

Details of future events, such as the end of year musical, will be released early in the next half term.
