Weekly Round Up

Nursery - Welcome back. We hope you have had good break. We cannot believe it is the last half term. Our topic is Superheroes. This week we have looked at animals with superpowers and our book of the week has been 'Superworm'. We have been ordering worms by size, painted worms and looked for them in the garden. We have learnt a new song: 'Wiggly Woo'. On Wednesday, we have celebrated World Environmental Day and we talked to the children how to save our planet. We have learnt words: reduce, reuse, recycle and children used junk modelling to make something new. They made houses, rockets, buttercups and lamps. Children also learnt what materials to put in a recycling bin.

Reception – This year in Reception, we have continued our topic 'what can we see and how does it change?' We have been thinking about how we grow and change throughout our life and have been talking about what we can do now that we could not when we were babies. We have enjoyed looking at baby photos and would love to see more so please continue to send to learning journals or Reception@stbartsleeds.org.uk. In Maths, we have been sharing into equal groups and investigating odd and even numbers.

Year 1 & 2 – this week in Year 1, the children have read the book '10 Things We Can Do To Help Our Planet'. They have thought about we can look after the world we all live in and have been courageous advocates for this cause. The children have worked hard to produce leaflets to inform other children in school how they can help save the planet. Children in Year 2 have been learning about healthy choices in science. They have thought about how they can keep healthy and the importance of eating healthy, exercise and hygiene. The children worked in groups to sort different facts into healthy and unhealthy choices.

Year 3 & 4 — This week, Year 3 have enjoyed reading some mystery stories. Year 4 have started looking at newspapers and writing in this style. They have been amazed about the aliens that have recently visited school... In maths, year 3 have been reading the time and year 4 have been looking at coordinates. In science, we enjoyed looking at circuits during our electricity unit and we are now able to name the different parts. In RE, we have been learning what a guru is and we have been finding out more about Guru Nanak. Year 4 have also started their times table check tests. We will send out the results when we get them.

Year 5 & 6 –**Lessons** - In Geography, we have started to look at national parks and why they are important and who can use them. In Science, we have looked at adaptation and how cactus have adapted to survive in the desert.

Homework - A reminder that homework is now set on a Monday and the deadline for completing homework will be the following Monday. Children who do not complete their homework will be expected to stay in during Monday break time to discuss expectations. Children can attend Homework Club during Monday lunchtimes.

Swimming - Children need to bring a coat with them when the weather is forecast for rain – this will help children if they are walking to and from the Leisure Centre on their swimming days.

Personal Possessions - A reminder: Children who bring mobile phones into school (reminder: mobile phones only need to be brought into school if children travel to school and home on their own), keys, or anything else such as bus passes, need to be handed into the class teacher every morning.
