Change to the School day – The DFE expect all schools to be open 32 ½ hours per week from September, luckily we will only have to make a few small changes.

From September, we will continue to open at 8.30-8.50 for Classes 1-16. However, the register will be taken at 8.50am instead of 9am so your children must be on time. If they arrive after 9.20am, they will receive a late-present mark, which means for attendance it will be classed as an unauthorised absence and will affect their overall attendance.

The children in Classes 1-11 will finish school at 3.20pm and Classes 12-16 at 3.25pm. Any children left by 3.30pm will be taken to the office.

Nursery remains the same, children need to be here at 8.30am, the doors will close at 8.40am and they will finish Nursery at 3.30pm. Morning session is 8.30am -11.30am and Afternoon session is 12.30am -3.30pm.

**Breakfast and After School Club Prices** – Unfortunately we have had to review the cost of these provisions, the school cannot afford to keep the costs at their very low prices, it is costing the school too much to subsidise. We have looked at other schools and childcare provisions and what they charge and have consulted the governors about this. I know this will not be good news but we are a school and the funds need to be spent on the children's learning, so to continue providing this provision we need to increase the costs. They are still extremely reasonable compared to other schools and very cheap compared to private childcare.

**Breakfast Club** – This will be £1 per day but you will be able to just pay for the days you need. These will be booked in advance and as normal and the fees must still be paid each half term. The office do not have the capacity to take weekly payments for breakfast club.

After School Club – This will still be able to be paid for weekly, on a Monday. The costings will be:

3.30-4pm - £2

4-4.30pm - £4

4.30-5pm - £6

5-5.30pm - £8

You will book and pay for the days you need as you do now. Remember you can use Parent Pay. Any changes to your days once allocated will need to be discussed with Miss Lawson or Mrs Wainwright as it will depend on staffing, places will be limited as we need to be in ratios to maintain the safety of our children.

Letters to book places will be available from Monday 24<sup>th</sup> June at the office or you can request they are sent to you.

## **Weekly Round Up**

**Nursery** - This week in Nursery, our topic has been 'superfamily'. We have talked about different types of families, drawn families and created families with playdough. In Math's we practised matching the correct amount of objects to the right numeral. We practised positional language while placing dinosaurs in the right position. We have read few books about families and sang 'finger family' song. The children enjoyed looking after babies in our home corner. Our investigation tray was filled with soil with lots of pink superworms. The children have made cards for Father's Day this week. We wanted to wish all dads, grandfathers and uncles a Happy Father's day.

**Reception** – This week in Reception, we continued to learn about how we change and grow. We have really enjoyed looking at all the baby photos you have shared and playing guess who. We have been very busy in our outdoor area this week solving mathematical problems. We used our drainpipes, tyres and balls to solve addition problems. Taking turns to roll amount and find how many altogether. We are working hard to write our own addition number sentences. Next week as part of cultural week, Reception will be visiting St Bartholomew's church. We are looking forward to seeing inside the church, talking about what happens there, drawing pictures and listening to Mr Leadbeater play the organ.

**Year 1 & 2**—In Year 1 this week the children have been learning numbers to 100 in Maths. They have been investigating partitioning these numbers into tens and ones using base 10. In Year 2, children have recapped addition and subtraction in Maths using base 10. They have looked at how these abstract methods link to the written column method and have practiced these.

**IMPORTANT** - Next week children in Year 1 (classes 3 and 4) will be going on a local walk to the Sikh Temple. This is part of our Cultural Week celebrations where children will be learning about different religions and cultures in our diverse school.

Class 4 Update - As many parents/carers will have seen this week - Miss Harvey has been covering for Miss McSkimmings. Unfortunately, Miss McSkimmings will not be returning for the rest of term. The good news is that Miss Hainsworth has now returned from maternity leave and will be taking over in Class 4 on Monday for the rest of term. Miss Hainsworth is an experienced Year 1 teacher and is looking forward to coming into Class 4. We wish Miss McSkimmings all the best as she prepares to welcome her baby.

Year 3 & 4 – This week, Class 9 and 10 enjoyed their trip to Harlow Carr. They enjoyed learning about the plants and found their workshop very informative. Year 3 have enjoyed carrying on reading their Egyptian mystery story. In French, children have been practicing words they now know to support translation of a text. We understood a lot more than we would have at the start of the year. In Geography, we have been looking at the state of Florida and have been looking at what the weather is like there, as well as what there is to do. In Science, we have been building circuits to get a bulb to light up. As part of cultural week, we will be taking the children out of school on a local visit over the course of next week. Year 3 will be visiting the Temple and Year 4 will be visiting the Mosque. This will support their understanding of different places of worship that different people visit.

**Year 5 & 6 – Cultural Week** We will be looking forward to visiting our local mosque next week as part of our cultural week celebrations.

**Lineham Farm -** A big thank-you to all the families that attended our presentation on Year 5's upcoming visits to Lineham Farm. We had 31 families attend – excitement is building!

**Year 6 Hoodies** - We are delighted with the arrival of the Year 6 Leavers' Hoodies. Many children have received their hoodies as payment has been made. Children still waiting will receive their hoodies as soon as payment is made – cash, card or Parent Pay!

**Year 6 Trips to Flamingo Land -** Class 16 and some of Class 15 will be visiting Flamingo Land next Thursday and Class 17 and some of Class 15 will be visiting Flamingo Land on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> June. There will be no swimming on those days.
