Weekly Round Up

Nursery –This week we have continued our topic of autumn. The children used repeated phrases to retell the story of 'Owl Babies'. We have been learning some facts about Owls. The children have used descriptive language to describe autumn items (conker, pinecone, leaf, stick, and acorn). In Maths, we have continued to look at simple patterns and the children had a go at creating their own patterns using interlink cubes, beads and counting bears. In phonics, we have learnt two songs 'If you're happy and you know it' and 'Mrs Brown has a box' and the children listened to various sounds and guessed what they are. We have also made marks as part of our 'write dance' activity.

Reception –This week in Reception, we have been talking about where we live. We have been looking at photos of the local area and have been creating maps of our journey to school. We have talked about local landmarks and have used Google earth to explore familiar buildings. We have talked about special places in the local area and have used a range of materials and construction resources to create churches, temples and mosques. In Maths, we have been sorting in lots of different ways. We have enjoyed listening to the story the button box and sorting buttons by colour, shape, and size. We are very excited to be having a visit from Little City next week. We will be taking on the roles of people who help us in the community such as police officers, doctors and firefighters.

Year 1 & 2 -This week the children in Year 1 have been using their oracy skills in RE. They have learnt about the Christian and Islamic creation stories and thought about the similarities and differences between the two stories. Children worked in pairs to verbally articulate their thoughts to one another. Children in classes 3 and 4 will have brought home their bikability letters this week. Please can they be returned as soon as possible so we know how many children have permission to participate. In RE the children in Year 2 have been learning about how Jesus tells us to forgive and be generous to others. The children learnt the parable of the Prodigal Son and thought about the feelings of the two brothers throughout the story. The children enjoyed working in groups to sequence the events and retell the story.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, we have started to look at information texts in English. It has helped us learn more about the Anglo-Saxons. We looked in more detail about their religion this week too. In computing, we have been using the copy and paste functions to find images to make a text look better. In RE, we enjoyed learning about festivals of light and the symbolism it has in different religions. In PE, we put our football skills into a game situation. Next week, the children will be going on the field behind school to take part in a seed-gathering workshop run by Leeds City Council. The sessions will be fun, informative and link to our science topic for this half term.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In Art, we have started to sketch our wartime landscapes. In History, we have been learning about the Battle of Britain and its importance in World War 2. In Science, we have been investigating the properties of blood.

PE and Swimming - A reminder that children should be wearing their PE kits (including red t-shirt) when it is PE. Children should be wearing school uniform on the day they go swimming.
