Weekly Round Up

Nursery – In our last week of term, we have been exploring harvest vegetable: pumpkin. The children loved looking at them, describing and painting them. We have been ordering them according to their size and checking which ones are heavy and light. We opened them up and saw what was inside. In phonics, we have read pumpkin stories and the children learnt pumpkin song '5 little pumpkins'. We have also experimented of making strong fences for our munchkin pumpkins. On Wednesday, we had a visit from Classroom Kitchen. The children enjoyed chopping fruit and making their own fruit cups and guacamole.

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been talking about Autumn and the changes that we can see happening in our wonderful world. We have listened to lots of different autumn stories and learnt the song 'Autumn leaves are falling down'. We have used lots of natural resources to create artwork including leaf crowns, spiky hedgehogs and trees. We have enjoyed rolling pinecones and conkers down ramps, through tubes talking about how they look, feel, and smell.

Year 1 & 2 - Children in Year 1 have been exploring their senses in Science and how they help them to find out about the world around them. They have looked at the 5 senses and the different parts of the body associated with these. This week they focused on the sense of small. Children had fun exploring different smells such as oranges, vinegar, eggs and soap and classified them into smells they like and smells they do not like. In Year 2 this week in Science, the children have enjoyed investigating changing the shape of materials. They have used the words 'bend, squash, twist, stretch, pull and push' to describe how they can change the shape of materials such as playdough. They then worked in pairs to demonstrate how they could change their bodies into different shapes by bending, twisting and stretching. Please can we remind families that on PE days children need to come to school in trainers and that earrings are taken out at home if possible on these days.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, we have been celebrating Black History Month. We have been looking at a famous black woman called Bessie Coleman, who overcame many obstacles in her life. In Art, we have been drawing our own self-portraits in the style of Van Gogh, as we near the end of our unit of work about him and his famous works of Art. In French, Year 3 have been enjoying performing their French play scripts and Year 4 have been practising Duolingo. All children have login details and can use this app at home for free. In English, we have been writing and performing our kenning poems.

Art Gallery - On Friday 8th November, Year 3 parents/carers are invited to come and see some of your children's artwork from this term. We have been studying Van Gogh and have created some lovely pieces of art that we would love to showcase. As you collect your child, they will show you up to our spare classroom where you can look at our masterpieces!

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In Art, we have finished our World War 2 landscapes inspired by the artist Jacqueline Hurley. We have started our new topic in Geography this week: Mountains. In our first lesson, we have used atlases to locate the Seven Summits. In English, we have completed a week of creative writing – basing our writing around a scary setting!

Year 6 SATs Week - A reminder that Year 6 SATs week will begin on Monday 12th May 2025. It is vital that all children in Year 6 attend school that week. The test timetable will be as follows:
