#### Reminders

- School Gateway App Reminder we need everyone to download the school gateway app, as this
  will be how messages are sent out to parents/carers. Please make sure you have your
  notifications turned on so you do not miss any messages.



<u>Headlice</u> - Head Lice are a common problem in school-aged children. They cannot be prevented, but regular checking ensures early detection and treatment if necessary. Parents and carers should check their children's head once a week during hair washing. You need your usual shampoo, conditioner, and a detection comb — ask your local pharmacist to recommend a suitable one. Remember that you are looking for living moving lice, which is the only evidence that your child is infected. If you find a living louse, sellotape it to a piece of light coloured paper and take it to your local pharmacy (Leeds only) who will advise you and can provide free Hedrin lotion under the Pharmacy First Minor Ailments Scheme. Combs are available from the office.

#### **Weekly Round Up**

Nursery – What an exciting week it has been! When we came to school on Tuesday, we found big and small bear footprints leading to our bear cave! The children have been very eager to find the bears. They used magnifying glasses and searched the Nursery but sadly, no bears have been found. This week has been all about bears. We made bear caves, painted bears and read lots and lots of bear stories, some in the dark with the use of a torch. We counted bears and added the right amount of bears to the corresponding number cave. Our song of the week has been 'the bear went over the mountain'. The children have also been excited to share their favourite bears with us this week.

**Reception** – This week in Reception we have continued to spend time looking at maps. We have been learning what maps are used for and why they are important. We have found Leeds on the map and have made our own maps of the local area. In drawing club, we have been listening to the story Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have been drawing the characters from the story and describing the troll. In Maths, we have been finding one more and one less counting forward and backwards.

Year 1 & 2 - This week in Year 1, the children have been investigating what an explorer is as part of their History topic. They have thought about migration and how people in the past have discovered new places. Children have looked at pictures of famous explorers in the past such as Ernest Shackleton, Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. They have looked for clues in the pictures to think about how long ago these people lived. The children in Year 2 have enjoyed the start of their History topic on the Great Fire of London. They have learnt about the events that led up to the fire and what happened as a result. Children worked in groups to create a timeline of events and then used this to verbally retell the story of the Great Fire.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Class 10 enjoyed their trip to the theatre to see 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'. We also sent a letter last week telling Class 11 about their rescheduled show, which they missed because of the weather. We have all had our Roman days now, where we got dressed up as Romans and learned more about them. We also learned about Boudica and how the Romans nearly lost Britain. In PSHE, we are looking at strengths and challenges this term, and this week we looked at all of our achievements in our lives so far. In French, Year 3 have been looking at the names of different foods and Year 4 have been looking at the names of pets. In PE, we have started our new units on gymnastics and fitness.

**Year 5 & 6 – Lessons -** In Art, we have enjoyed learning about the artist, MC Escher. In History, we have looked at how Islam spread quickly around the world. In English, we have started reading our new book, Skellig and enjoyed writing emails to Michael's friends.

**Homework** - Children are expected to read their reading book at home every night. We also encourage children to use Reading Plus at home. Each week, children will be set homework the following on Emile: grammar, punctuation, spelling and Maths. Homework is set on a Monday and needs to be completed by the following Monday. There is a homework club every Monday and Thursday lunchtimes for any children wishing to complete their homework in school.

**Year 6 SATs briefing -** We will be holding a SATs information session for families on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> February at 6pm. The event will start at 6pm and will last no longer than one hour.
