Attendance – A lot of parents have asked about how this week will affect their child's attendance. - Wellington Boots these may be great for walking to school in bad weather but can be dangerous when worn in school, they can be slippery especially on the stairs. If they wear wellies please send a change of shoes, we are happy to help them if needed.
- Themed Lunch Will be on Thursday 16th January and all children entitled to free school meals in Years 3 to 6 will be provided with one to try. All children in Reception to Year 2 will also be offered one. This is a great opportunity for children to try school dinners. If they normally bring packed lunch, they still can. Please let school know if you do not want them to try one, remember all children in Reception to Year 2 are entitled to a free meal every day.
- Holidays Taking children out of school on unauthorised holidays in term time may affect your child's BC and ASC place and will mean they will not be prioritised for any holiday schemes.
- Punctuality the amount of children being late after 8.40am in Nursery and 8.50am in the rest of school is having a negative impact on your child's learning and wellbeing and on the education of the rest of the children. <u>CHILDREN MUST BE HERE ON TIME</u>
- School Gateway App Reminder we need everyone to download the school gateway app, as this will be how messages are sent out to parents/carers. Please make sure you have your notifications turned on so you do not miss any messages.

Weekly Round Up

Nursery – Happy New Year to all! This week we discussed the transition between autumn and winter. We talked about cold weather and how to be safe in winter. We have read lots of winter stories and sang winter songs. We made snowy pictures using chalk and white paint. We also made igloos using Lego blocks.

Reception – This week in Reception we have started our new Topic 'Where can we go and how can we get there ' we have been talking about where we live and what we can see in our local area. We have enjoyed looking at maps and finding the United Kingdom and Leeds. We have really enjoyed P.E this week. We have learnt some gymnastic shapes such as straight, tuck, straddle and pike. In Maths, we have been learning about zero. We have been sorting zero and not zero with our talk partner. Please continue to send pictures of fun you had in the snow to Learning journals.

Year 1 & 2 - Welcome back to a new term full of lots of exciting learning opportunities and topics for the children in Years 1 and 2. This half term the children in Year 1 will be exploring the topic of Antarctic Adventures where they will be learning about the polar regions and about famous explorers such as Robert Falcon Scott. In Year 2 the children will be Learning about the events and people of The Great Fire of London. They will be looking at the diary of Samual Pepys to help find out about this period in history.

Year 3 & 4 - Welcome back and a happy new year to all of our children and families.

This week, we have started reading our new class story: The Iron Man. We have been looking at the opening chapter and describing the Iron Man. We have also started looking at the Romans, and why they came to Britain. Over the next two weeks, the children will be dressing up as Romans and having a special day in class looking at them. In Science, we have started looking at light, shadows, and how light travels. In RE, we have enjoyed taking a closer look at Judaism and where they worship. In art, we have started looking at printing, which is our topic for this half term.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In Science, we have started our new topic about electricity – we recapped electrical symbols and used diagrams to make our own electrical circuits – experimenting with what makes a bulb brighter/dimmer. In History, we have been introduced to the topic of The Islamic Empire and learnt about what impact the Islamic Empire has had on our modern world. In Art, we have been introduced to Islamic Art and investigated calligraphy.

Swimming - Swimming lessons start again next week (week beginning 13th January).

Homework - Children are expected to read their reading book at home every night. We also encourage children to use Reading Plus at home. Each week, children will be set homework the following on Emile: grammar, punctuation, spelling and Maths. Homework is set on a Monday and needs to be completed by the following Monday. There is a homework club every Monday and Thursday lunchtimes for any children wishing to complete their homework in school.

Year 6 SATs briefing - We will be holding a SATs information session for families this term. We will let you know the date of this information session next week.

Year 6 SATs Week - A reminder that Year 6 SATs week will begin on Monday 12th May 2025. It is vital that all children in Year 6 attend school that week. The test timetable will be as follows:
