OFSTED - We hope you had chance to read the OFSTED report, it is only a short reflection of a very intense two days. The children were fantastic and we were so proud of them. We will make sure we look at their feedback and over time will make any changes we think will help us improve what we do for our children. Worship – Our current theme and attribute is <u>courage</u> and this week we read the bible story about Moses showing courage to lead his people to safety. Lots of children contributed in worship and told us about things that scare them when they have to show courage and be brave. KS1 learned a new song and we worked together on the actions. We also talked about the **British Values** of **Respect**, where we said we needed to understand what others may be fearful of and **Liberty**, having the choice to help someone be courageous.

What we are doing to make things better - We are currently looking at how we can provide more activities for children when they are out at break and lunch.

Governors Update – The Teaching and Learning committee met and Mr Leadbeater told them all about our fantastic music curriculum and wider opportunities. They were impressed with all we do and with how enthusiastic a leader Mr Leadbeater is – music is in safe hands! They also talked about our school data and started to discuss our fantastic OFSTED report.

Weekly Round Up

Nursery –This week our focus text has been 'Goldilocks and the three bears'. We have built houses, beds and chairs for Goldilocks and the bears using construction blocks. We have learnt 'When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears' song and continued singing 'The bear went over the mountain' in the outdoor area while travelling under and over various outdoor equipment. In Maths, we have revised sizes and sort bears, chairs, bowls, spoons and shapes into big/medium/small categories. In phonics we listened to lots of bear books, sang bear songs and explored simple rhyming words. Our older pupils had a go in writing/copying letters from their name cards and our younger pupils made few pattern marks.

Reception – This week in Reception, we have talked about London and learnt that is the capital city of England. We have looked at London landmarks and have used large and small-scale construction materials to create Tower Bridge, Buckingham Palace and Big Ben. We painted flags to attach to our models. After talking about how there are lots of red buses in London we read the story the Naughty Red Bus. The children really enjoyed talking about what mischief the bus was getting up to throughout the day. In Maths, we have been exploring composition of amounts and finding different ways to make 4.

Year 1 & 2 - Exciting News!!

Next week we have some exciting curriculum days for children in Years 1 and 2. On Monday the 27th January, Year 2 (Classes 5 and 6) will be taking part in a special Great Fire of London Day. They will be visited by Sir William Petty - a character from 1666 who will help them understand more about the events of the Great Fire and learn from his friend Samual Pepys, who write a diary about what happened.

On Tuesday 28th January Year 1 (Classes 3 and 4) will be taking part in a Polar Explorers Day delivered by Dantastic Education. They will be visited by a Polar explorer and will look at the different artefacts and equipment which was used to help adventurers successfully visit the polar regions. Both days are sure to be exciting opportunities in bringing our curriculum to life. You will be able to see them in action on our website later in the week.

Year 3 & 4 - This week, Years 3 and 4 have been learning to use inverted commas to punctuate speech. We have continued to read the Iron Man and Year 4 have been using inference skills to think deeper about the story. In RE, we have continued looking at Judaism and what a covenant is. In science, we have been looking at how light reflects on some materials and how this can help us think about reflective jackets that can keep us safe when we are near roads. In History, we have been looking at a lady called Claudia, who was a commanders wife. We were amazed to see that she had written the oldest letter found and what this told us about the Romans.

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons - In History, we have been comparing Anglo Saxons settlements compared to Baghdad in the Islamic Civilisation. In Music, we have been rehearsing and performing La Bamba. In Art, we have been completing tessellation patterns – planning designs ready to complete them next week.

Homework -Children are expected to read their reading book at home every night. We also encourage children to use Reading Plus at home. Each week, children will be set homework the following on Emile: grammar, punctuation, spelling and Maths. Homework is set on a Monday and needs to be completed by the following Monday. There is a homework club every Monday and Thursday lunchtimes for any children wishing to complete their homework in school.

Year 6 SATs briefing -We will be holding a SATs information session for families on Wednesday 12th February at 6pm. The event will start at 6pm and will last no longer than one hour.
