

NURSERY PLACES – We will have Nursery places available in September this year. If you have a child who is currently 3 years old or turning 3 this year, please register them at the office. If your child is not 3 yet, you can still complete the registration forms in advance and if there is a place available when they turn 3 we will contact you nearer the time. We are very popular and are currently full, so if you would like a place next year please speak to Mrs Drake in the office.

How to Keep Safe Week - Next week in school it is How to Keep Safe Week, and we will be learning about keeping safe across school. As part of this week, the children will be learning the NSPCC's PANTS rules. This information is designed to teach pupils how to stay safe within different relationships with different people. In the lesson, children will learn about the 'PANTS' acrostic, which stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help

Milk - We will be providing children in Years 1-6 with the opportunity to have milk in school for the summer term. Nursery and Reception children already receive it free of charge. For children entitled to benefit related free school meals this will be free but you must still complete a form for the summer

term requesting this for your child, for all others it must be ordered and paid for in advance for the term. The cost for the summer term will be £18.00. Forms can be collected from the office from Monday 17th March. All forms must be completed and returned to the office by Monday 31st March. Payments can be made on ParentPay or card at the office, as we no longer accept cash in school. If you would like to pay on ParentPay, please call or message the office to let us know then we can add it to your account. We cannot accept late payments, as we need to order the milk in advance. Once this has been paid, we cannot provide refunds.

Attendance - Make sure your child comes to school every day and on time. 8.30am for Nursery, 12.30pm in the afternoon and by 8.50am for the rest of school. Thank you

Weekly Round Up

Nursery – For the last two weeks, we have been practising positional language in Nursery. Our focussed texts were: The Billy Goats Gruff and Rosie's Walk. We talked about farm animals and sang: Old McDonald had a farm. We made some experiments with objects and checked if they would float or sink. Our new sound in phonics was 'a'. We have been talking about our mums and made lovely cards to wish them Happy Mother's day. We have also talked about Ramadan and Eid and we would like to wish a 'Happy Eid' to all who celebrate.

Reception – This week in Reception, we have enjoyed listening to the story Emma Jane's aeroplane. We have talked about the different cities she visits around the world and the different animals she meets. In RE, we have been talking about Ramadan and how Muslims are preparing for Eid. The children really enjoyed sharing their experiences. We have made Eid cards to share with our families. We would love to see any photos of your celebrations next week. In Maths, we have been working hard to recognise and order numbers and have made our own number Lines.

Years 1 & 2 – This week Year 1 have really enjoyed their visit to Temple Newsam Farm and House. The children loved their time at the farm where they got to see how the animals are cared for and the different jobs there is to do around the farm. In the afternoon the children extended their understanding of the book, they have been looking at in English lessons and participated in a Jack and The Beanstalk workshop. What a fun visit we all had! In Year 2, the children have continued to design and construct their own fire engines as part of their DT topic. The children have constructed the axel and chassis of their vehicles and added wheels. They experimented with finding the best place to have their axels and wheels so the engine was strong, sturdy and functional.

Years 3 & 4 – This week, Years 3 and 4 have continued reading the story 'Escape from Pompeii' and have learned about the devastating volcanic eruption that happened there. In RE, we have been learning about Moses and using our oracy skills to discuss why we think we was a good leader. Year 3 have also enjoyed their weekly ukulele lesson, where we have been practising some short songs. In DT, we made our sandwiches that we had designed previously. We had a focus on trying to make them healthy.

Swimming - There will be no swimming lessons next week. Swimming will start again in the second week of the Summer Term (Week beginning 28th April). Thank-you to all the children for their efforts in the swimming pool.

Lessons - We have tried extremely hard with our tests this week. Children have completed the following tests:

- Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling
- Reading
- Arithmetic, Reasoning 1 & Reasoning 2

Homework - Children have the opportunity to complete a variety of tasks set for the Spring Term — children have received a paper copy. We have dedicated display space for children's work to be displayed and Trackit points will be awarded to children bringing in their work.
