Weekly Round Up

Nursery – What an exciting week we have had! We have had some eggs delivered and have seen ducklings hatching. We have continued reading The Very Hungry Caterpillar and read traditional story: The Ugly Duckling. In Math's, we explored 3D shapes and counted out ducks and fruit. Outdoors we explored minibeasts, made spring bakes in the mud kitchen and continued to fix bikes in our bike repair shop.

Reception – This week in Reception, we had a very exciting arrival. We received seven eggs in an incubator and four chicks hatched on Thursday! We have been spending lots of time looking at the eggs and talking about the chicks. We have been learning about the life cycle of a chick, sequencing life cycle pictures and making our own poster about how to care for living things. In drawing club, we have been reading the story 'The odd egg'. We have been learning about the different animals that come from eggs and the children was really surprised to learn that a crocodile and a snake come from an egg! In Maths, we have been solving addition problem using first then and now stories.

Years 1 & 2—In Geography, the children in Year 1 have been looking at a contrasting locality in the world that is very different to where we live in Leeds. The children have been learning about the water village called Kampong Ayer. It is small town located in Brunei, which is very close to the equator. They have been looking at how people can travel around this area and how many use boats as there are no roads. The Year 2 children have been learning about the famous female pirate called Grace O'Malley who led a rebellion against Elizabeth 1st. This week they looked at what happened when Grace met the Queen. The children have thought about how the conversation may have gone and have written speech bubbles to identify what the two women may have said to each other.

Years 3 & 4 –This week, we have been reading poetry, in the form of song lyrics. We have looked at the language structure of 'It's a Wonderful World' and started writing our own verses. In History, we have been looking at what makes a good ruler, looking at the Tudors and how they led. In PSHE, we have been continuing to look at money and how to be responsible with money. Class 11 also enjoyed their trip to the sculpture park this week, where they looked at the different pieces of art around the park and created their own junk sculptures in the afternoon.

Years 5 & 6 – Year 6 SATs Week - A big thank-you to the children (and the staff) for all their hard work leading up to next week. It will be very important that all children arrive in school on time so that we can settle the children and get started as soon as we can. We have constantly reinforced the message that 'trying your best is the most important thing.'
