#### **REMINDERS**

 School Streets – The restrictions on Strawberry Lane are in place every day, even if a member of staff is not on duty with the barrier. You must follow these restrictions and cannot drive in or out of Strawberry Lane between 8.15am and 9am and 3pm and 3.45am unless you are a Blue Badge holder or have a permit. This is to make the street safe for our children and families.

#### You can be fined for driving on the street between these times.

If your child is not 3 yet, you can still complete the registration forms in advance and if there is a place available when they turn 3 we will contact you nearer the time. We are very popular and are currently full, so if you would like a place next year please speak to Mrs Drake in the office.

#### **Weekly Round Up**

Nursery – This week we have continued with our theme of minibeasts. Our focus has been bees. We have learnt some facts about bees, what they look like, where they live and how they make honey. We made some bees using collage and paint. We have learnt a bee song: 'Here Is The Beehive' and read 'The Very Greedy Bee' story. In Maths, we counted the bees and made bugs using 2D shapes. We have also explored BeeBots. The children learnt how to use them, what buttons to press to go straight, go back, turn left, turn right. We have opened Aldi supermarket. The children really enjoyed using baskets and buying items in the shop.

**Reception** – This week in Reception, we have been caring for the chicks. We have enjoyed watching them grow their feathers and have sang songs and read to them in their cage. We also received some caterpillars and have been keen to watch them getting bigger each day. We have continued our learning about life cycles and have sequenced the life cycle of both chicks and caterpillars. In Maths, we have been subitising amounts and have been exploring different ways to make 6.

Years 1 & 2 —In Math's this week children in Year 1 have been continuing their work on finding fractions - this week finding a quarter. They have practically investigated finding a quarter of different shapes and pictures and then have moved on to finding a quarter of a number. At home, they could practice further by doing practical tasks such as cutting their food up into quarters, making sure the quarters are the same size. In Year 2 the children have worked very hard understanding how to tell the time on an analogue clock. They have focused on 'quarter past' and 'quarter to' times and then some children have been able to move on to telling the time in intervals of 5 minutes. This is a really challenging topic for children so any extra practice at home would be really useful.

**Years 3 & 4** –This week, we have been looking at how to write persuasively and writing letters about not littering. In History, we looked at how Elizabeth I expanded the empire. In PSHE, we looked at the ever-changing world of payments types and thought about ways we can pay for things in shops and online. In Art, we have taken home our clay sculptures and continued to look at different art forms we can sculpt with.

**Years 5 & 6 – Year 6 SATs Week** - A big thank-you to all the children for their hard work in SATs week. The children were amazing and they applied themselves magnificently! We are very proud of them all!

The children in Year 6 have plenty to look forward to, including their trips to Flamingo Land. A reminder that we are taking voluntary contributions for Flamingo Land – we would really appreciate voluntary donations from all children.
