Something Mrs Wainwright has enjoyed this week was seeing many of our new reception children and families visit school on Tuesday evening. Some are currently in Nursery, others will be new to our school in September. We are looking forward to them all starting the next stage of their school journey.

Lineham Farm – I would like to thank all the staff who gave up their time to go with the children this year, it would not be possible without them. The children had a great time and I am sure they will be telling you all about it. We hope all of next year's Year 5 children join in the fun.

NURSERY – We will have Nursery places available in September so if you have a 3 year old not in a school Nursery please ask Mrs Drake at the office.

Worship – Our current theme is <u>respect</u> and this week we looked at the mosaic displayed in the United Nations with their Golden Rule, 'do unto others as you would have them do unto you'. We reflected on different situations where we should apply this rule in our lives. We also reflected on our Big Question, **'Who do you respect and why do they deserve it?'** This week the children identified family members who they respected and why. We also talked about the **British Values** of 'respect' and 'tolerance'

What we are doing to make things better - This week the school had a meeting with Leeds Council to discuss the next stage of the roof that is being replaced over the summer holiday. This will be over classes 8, 9, 10, 11 and 14. In a few more years, it should be completely finished!

Governors Update – We had a full governing body meeting this week. The governors looked at what we had been doing this year and discussed some important policies. They asked us questions about things like safeguarding and attendance. A new safeguarding governor was appointed and he will make regular visits to school next year. We also confirmed the other governor roles and they will be visiting in the autumn to see what goes on in Maths, English, EYFS and other important areas. We would like to thank the governors including our two new parent governors for supporting our school.

REMINDERS AND UPDATES

- PE T- shirts From September we are not supplying PE t-shirts for children. All children should wear a normal school polo on PE days and black or grey tracksuit bottoms, leggings or shorts. We made this decision as we could not source enough for all the children and it is another way we can make the expectations simpler for parents and save money.
- **End of term** School closes on Friday 18th July at 3.30pm and we expect all children to be in up to the last day. We allocated Monday 21st and Tuesday 22nd as training days so we had a full 6 weeks for the summer.
- **Breakfast Club and After School Club applications** were due in by today. If you have missed this and require a place for your children in September, you must see Mrs Wainwright to discuss being put on the waiting list.



Milk - We will be providing children in Years 1-6 with the opportunity to have milk in school for the autumn term. Nursery and Reception children already receive it free of charge. For children entitled to benefit related free school meals this will be free but you must still complete a form for the autumn term requesting this for your child, for all others it must be ordered and paid for in advance for the term. The cost for the autumn term will be £22.50. Forms can be collected from the office from Monday 30th June.

All forms must be completed and returned to the office by Monday 14th July. Payments can be made by ParentPay or card at the office we no longer accept cash in school. If you would like to pay by ParentPay, please call or message the office to let us know then we can add it to your account.

We cannot accept late payments, as we need to order the milk in advance. Once this has been paid, we cannot provide refunds.

Attendance - Make sure your child comes to school every day and on time. 8.30am for nursery, 12.30pm in the afternoon and by 8.50am for the rest of school. Thank you

Weekly Round Up

Reception – This week in Reception, we have been talking about what we want to be when we grow up. We have had lots of fun taking on the different roles of people who help us in the community. Our favourite job was the doctor. We used the stethoscope to listen to our heartbeat and used the thermometer to check our temperature. In drawing club, we have listened to the story 'The Hairy Toe' We have made predictions about what might happen at the end of the story and talked about how we could trap the monster. In Maths we have been doubling numbers to 10 using dice, Numicon and tens frames.

Years 3 & 4 – This week in Years 3 and 4, the children have been writing their own playscripts inspired by *Macbeth*, getting creative with characters and dialogue. In geography, they have been practising their map-reading skills, using a key to find different features and exploring various environments. The start of a new DT project saw pupils designing their own wallets, thinking about materials and functionality, as well as colour choices and stitch styles. In PSHE, the focus was on water safety in the local area, with important discussions on how to stay safe near rivers and lakes. Well done to all the children in Year 4 who achieved well in their times tables results, we are very proud of them.
