#### **Weekly Round Up**

**Nursery** – This week we have been exploring a harvest vegetable: pumpkin. The children loved looking at different coloured pumpkins, describing and painting them. We have been ordering them according to their size and checking which ones are heavy and light. We opened them up and saw what was inside. In phonics we have read pumpkin stories and the children learnt pumpkin song '5 little pumpkins'.

**Reception** – This week in Reception we have been learning the story 'Little Red Riding Hood' using a story map and actions. We have enjoyed sequencing the story and describing the big bad wolf. We have continued to talk about where we live and have drawn our own maps of our journey to school. We have talked about the people who help us in our community and are looking forward to a visit from Little City next week. In Maths we have been continuing and creating repeating patterns using a range of different natural objects and loose parts.

**Year 1 & 2-** This week the children in Year 1 really enjoyed their walk around the local area as part of their History topic. They were looking at old and modern buildings and how the area has changed over time. The children looked at places important to our community such as the church, mosque, library and the leisure centre. In Year 2 the children have continued their learning about their topic of Castles, Kings and Queens and have enjoyed reading the book 'The Paper Bag Princess'. They have orally rehearsed sentences to describe the princess and have then written compound sentences using 'and'. Remember that next week the children will be having a Kings and Queens day on Friday the 24<sup>th</sup> of October. Please refer to the letter that was sent out for further details.

Year 3 & 4 — Last week and this week, Year 3 have enjoyed taking part in some workshops in our school garden. We have been preparing the soil and doing some planting, as well as learning about vegetables. In English, we have been reading and writing Kenning poems, links to our class story Beowulf. In maths, we have enjoyed doing column addition and subtracting, including when there is an exchange. In History, we have explored Sutton Hoo and looked at the Anglo-Saxon artifacts that were found there.

Year 4 - Last week and this week, we really enjoyed our trip to Armley Mills. We took part in a role-play task, where we were transported back in time to be Victorian children in a classroom. We then explored the museum and found out more about what it was like to be a child in Armley during the time period. In English, we have enjoyed writing playscripts and in art we have been creating our own Lowry inspired pictures. In PSHE, we looked at stereotypes and what discrimination can look like.

**Homework** - This year, our homework is all done digitally and can be completed on a laptop, tablet or phone. Children are expected to complete 20 minutes on Times Table Rockstars and complete tasks on Oxford Owl. If you have any trouble getting on, please see the class teacher or speak to Mr Waters. Homework helps children secure what they have learned in school and sets good habits for later on in life, including high school.

**Year 5 & 6 – Lessons:** In Geography, we have started our 'Rivers' topic. We have looked at the water cycle and how rivers are formed. We have used atlases to locate the largest rivers in the world. In Science, we have been learning about the phases of the moon. We are amazed to discover that when the new moon forms there is no visible moon in the sky.
