## ***“Excellent attendance is vital for children to flourish and achieve”***

Something Mrs Wainwright has enjoyed this week was seeing how well the children behaved in worship. The children are always keen to contribute in our weekly worship. We invite children to join in our prayer and always have time for quiet reflection and they are always respectful and thoughtful.

**Worship** – Our current theme is **perseverance** and this week we talked about people who have to leave their home and travel a long way to safety, starting with Mary and Joseph who fled to Egypt with Jesus. We reflected on how we can help new children to our school and make them feel welcome after they have persevered and kept going when life was difficult.

We also reflected on our Big Question, ‘**Why is life like a race?**’ we discussed how we all have times in our life when things are difficult, sometimes these things can be small, like finding a maths lesson hard sometimes much bigger like losing your home.

We have also discussed our attribute, ‘**resilience**’. We need to be resilient when we find things difficult.

**The St Bart’s way** – The children leading in and out of worship this week really showed the St Bart’s way and how we walk in school with our classes, well done and keep it up.

### **REMINDERS:**

- ❖ **Punctuality** – children need to be in school on time, we are having increasing numbers of children coming through the office after 8.50am and this is affecting the work of the office and other staff who have to manage this. Occasional lateness cannot always be helped and we understand this but regular lateness is not acceptable.

**Weekly Round Up**

**Nursery** – We continue to learn about winter and winter animals. This week our focus story has been 'Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What Can You Hear?'. We looked at various animals and listened to sounds they make. During creative activities we painted polar bears and other characters from the story, and we made houses for the animals using junk modelling. In Maths we looked at positional language and practised the vocabulary by placing penguins in, on, under, and behind various objects. We had write dance sessions where we used scarves and danced to music.

**Reception** – This week in Reception we have been listening to the story 'Emma Janes Aeroplane' and learning about the different places she visits on her journey. We have used puppet props and story maps to retell the story and have enjoyed looking at photographs of Big Ben, The Statue of Liberty and the Eiffel Tower. In Maths we have been comparing amounts using vocab more and fewer. We have used practical resources to show more and fewer and have been counting carefully to find out how many more.

**Years 1 & 2** – This week Years 1 and 2 have completed some excellent work in their art lessons.

The children in Year 1 have been experimenting with sculpture in the style of Francois Pompon. In their oracy lesson they have looked at the different animals he has sculpted and said which is their favourite and why. Children used clay to sculpt an Antarctic seal. In Year 2 the children have been experimenting with collage in the style of the artist Jesse Treece. They have studied how he created backgrounds and foregrounds and layered different materials to create effects. Children have looked at different materials to create an image of fire as part of their work on the Great Fire of London.

**Years 3 & 4** – This week, Year 3 have enjoyed reading Chapter 4 of the Iron Man, where we met the mysterious space creature who came to battle him! In Maths, we have been practising our method for division, using base ten and counters to help us understand when we need to exchange. In computing, we enjoyed recording our presentations using a green screen - we look forward to bringing these to life in the coming weeks. In French, we enjoyed talking about foods we liked and disliked.

This week in Year 4, we enjoyed writing the end of our own adventure story. In Maths, we have been looking at measurements and have been converting between cm and m. In RE, we looked at qualities religious leaders must have and in History we looked at artifacts found from the Stone Age era. In Art, we enjoyed sewing the outline on our final pieces of work.
