Something Mrs Wainwright has enjoyed this week was another great day in Class 6, it is lovely to teach again and spend time in class with the children.

Worship – Our current theme is **perseverance** and this week we reflected on how it is sometimes hard to keep going but we should not give up when things are difficult. We read the story of Jeremiah from the bible and how he did not give up when telling God's words to the king.

We also reflected on our Big Question, '**Why is life like a race?**' and how sometimes in life's journey we have good and bad times but we can get through them and should ask for help if we need it.

We have also discussed our attribute, '**Resilience**' which goes hand in hand with perseverance.

Weekly Round Up

Nursery – This week we have continued to focus on 'Polar Bear Polar Bear' story. The children liked guessing what animal a teacher was describing and they had a go themselves in describing an animal. We drew our favourite animals paying attention to features like: ears, necks, patterns, beaks, trunks, tails, etc. The children did really well in drawing their animals. In Maths we measured the animals using stacking cubes, sang number songs and focussed on number two. In arts we painted our animals and made houses for them using junk modelling. In phonics we started to learn about rhyme and continued to clap syllables in our names and new learnt vocabulary.

Reception – This week in Reception we have been learning about the capital city of London. We have been learning all about London landmarks and have worked hard to build our own Big Ben, Tower Bridge and Buckingham Palace. We have talked about the Royal family and their job. In Maths we have been singing the song '5 little men in a flying saucer' and finding different ways to make 5. We have used double sided counters and dice frames to explore number bonds.

Years 1 & 2 – This week has been a great week in Key Stage 1.

Year 1 children have really impressed their teachers during their phonics assessments and it has been fantastic to see how much progress children have made with their reading. We are really grateful to all parents and carers who encourage their children to read their books at home as many of these children have made more progress than expected. Children have also really enjoyed being Antarctic explorers in the provision areas.

Children in Year 2 have been extremely busy with 2 exciting workshops this week. Firstly, they really enjoyed their Great Fire of London History workshop where they had a visitor called William Petty from 1666 visit their classes to tell them all about what happened to him during the Great Fire. They used their investigation skills to look at different evidence from the past in order to find out about what happened. On Wednesday Year 2 children also had a great time with staff from the NSPCC who delivered workshops about keeping safe and helped the children understand what they can do if they are worried about things.

Years 3 & 4 – This week, Year 3 have enjoyed reading and writing some junkyard poems, inspired by the book 'The Iron Man', which they have enjoyed looking at this half term. In Maths, we have been looking at length and measurement and have been looking at mm, cm and m. In History, we have enjoyed looking at features of Roman towns and have been designing our own. In art, we enjoyed using polystyrene tiles to make prints of Roman coins. This week, Year 4 have been performing a poem called 'Walking with my Iguana'. We have been looking at what makes a good performance and how we can use our voices and bodies to improve how it is received. In History, we have been looking at the Bronze Age and how it links to the Stone Age. In Science, we have enjoyed looking at the weather, and some classes have completed their absorption investigations after the rain spoiled it last week!
