WHAT HAS BEEN GOING ON?

Pupils in KS1 have been immersed in the joyful rhythms of their music unit 'My Musical Heartbeat.' Each lesson has centred around a different song, helping children explore the concept of pulse – the steady beat that forms the heartbeat of every piece of music. Through this unit, pupils have learned that every piece of music has a pulse, a steady beat that we can feel and move to. Whether singing, listening, or performing, they've been encouraged to find that beat and keep it together as a group, building musical confidence and coordination. It has been a vibrant, energetic term full of musical discovery, and KS1 have truly found their heartbeat!

This lesson focused on Shapes by Joanna Mangona and Pete Readman. The children loved moving to the music, using claps, marches, and sways to find and follow the pulse. They explored musical patterns and shapes, discovering how rhythm and movement can bring a song to life.

This term, our Lower Key Stage 2 pupils have been exploring the exciting world of composing, playing, and reading music through their topic 'Writing Music Down.'

They've been learning how to read and write musical notes, discovering how many beats each note holds, and beginning to use the correct musical terminology. The children have also enjoyed composing their own short rhythms, putting their new knowledge into practice with


