Internet Matters (<u>internetmatters.org</u>)

Offers step-by-step parental controls guides, advice on age-appropriate apps, and practical tips for managing screen time and privacy settings.

UK Safer Internet Centre (saferinternet.org.uk)

Provides guidance on online safety, including reporting harmful content, and resources for talking to children about responsible internet use.

Current Online Challenges

Be aware of trends such as viral dares and risky challenges circulating on platforms like TikTok and Instagram. These can encourage unsafe behaviour, so regular conversations about online choices are essential.

- Set up parental controls before your child uses a new device.
- Encourage open conversations about what they see online.
- Remind them never to share personal information or engage in harmful challenges.

Norah's North Pole





Local Scouts Shine at Seaham Santa 5K Run


